

### Survey: Small Business Owners Overwhelmingly Support \$1.9 Trillion Relief Plan, Say Congress Should Pass it Even Without GOP Support

### **KEY FINDINGS**

#### Small businesses support more government relief

- From Feb. 13-18, 2021, Small Business for America's Future conducted a national survey of 1,241
   small business owners in its network to learn about ongoing pandemic impacts on their businesses and test their opinions about government priorities and the proposed American Rescue Plan.
- 69% of small business owners including 46% of Republican business owners and 61% of independent small business owners — support the American Rescue Plan.
- A majority (56%) of small business owners said that Democrats in Congress should pass a larger relief bill as soon as possible, even if it doesn't have support from Republicans in Congress — including 52% of independents and 23% of Republicans.
- Small business owners want Congress to prioritize economic relief over deficit reduction.

### **KEY FINDINGS**

#### Small businesses continue to struggle — particularly businesses owners of color

- More than one-third of small business owners—including 51% of Black and 42% of Latinx business owners—say their business would only be able to operate for a few more months without additional relief.
- 80% of small business owners think another round of PPP is needed, including 94% of Black business owners and 89% of Latinx business owners.
- 40% of small business owners—including 47% of Black business owners and 43% of Latinx business owners—say that the number of people employed by their business has decreased as a result of Covid.
- 60% of small business owners would primarily use funds from a new Covid relief bill to keep employees on the job.






### Q3: Since the start of the pandemic, have you had to do any of the following when it comes to your employees? (Check all that apply)



### Q4: Has the number of people your business employs changed as a result of the pandemic?




### Q5: How long can your business continue to operate if you do not receive any additional relief in the near future?










