DAY ONE

MORNING



Start at the White Rock Visitor Center.



- Travel to Bandelier National Monument. Be sure
 to check out the visitor center, park movie and gift
 shop. There are numerous archeological sites along
 the Main Loop Trail —1.2 miles round-trip—and
 on the additional mile round-trip trail, including 4
 wooden ladders and many stone stairs to reach the
 spectacular Alcove House. The Bandelier staff can
 help you optimize your visit in accordance with your
 schedule and preferences.
- When you're done, take Highway 4 west, then turn on Highway 501 toward Los Alamos.







NOON



Head back to Los Alamos and experience one of our many restaurants. The **Los Alamos Visitor Center** has a list and menus to help you make your decision.

AFTERNOON



Explore the history of Los Alamos and the groundbreaking science that influenced the course of world history. Pick up a **Historic Walking Tour Map** at one of the museums or the **Los Alamos Visitor Center**.



 Take a guided tour to get a local perspective on Los Alamos' unique history, or take the tour on your own with a map.



 Start the tour at the History Museum (behind Fuller Lodge) and follow the tour around Fuller Lodge, Ashley Pond, Romero Cabin and other historic sites.

The **Bradbury Science Museum** is a must see for curious minds of all ages. While there, try out the many interactive exhibits, and be sure to catch a showing of the new film "Racing Toward Dawn."





Pop in to one of our many charming stores and boutiques, and pick up something to help you remember your Los Alamos experience.

Try planning your visit around one of our seasonal arts and crafts fairs to explore and purchase one-of-a-kind pieces from local artists.



LATE AFTERNOON/EVENING

Orient yourself with their exhibits, and talk to their friendly staff and volunteers to choose the perfect route for your time, skill level and interests, or download the free Los Alamos Trails app

to guide you. Be sure to pick up some free trail maps while you're there, or buy a topographic map of the whole area in the gift shop. Stick around and explore the



galaxy by taking in a planetarium show, or take part in one of the many fun and educational events and workshops at the Nature Center.
