The APP Pennsylvania General Election Survey was conducted by IVR Interviews and Online Mobile from July 15 - July 20 among a random sample of 700 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.7 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Are you 18 years of age and registered to vote in the state of Pennsylvania?

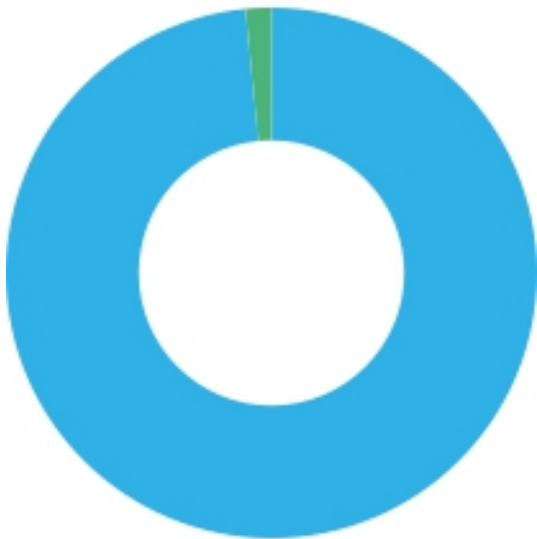

How likely are you to vote in the November 3rd General Election in Pennsylvania? Would you say you are extremely likely, somewhat likely, or not very likely?

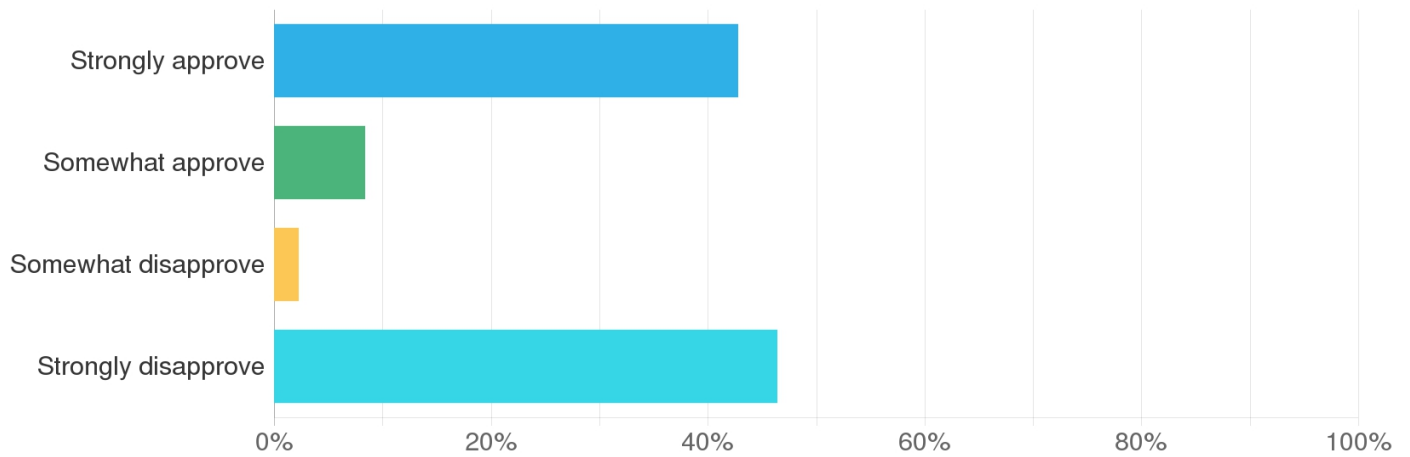

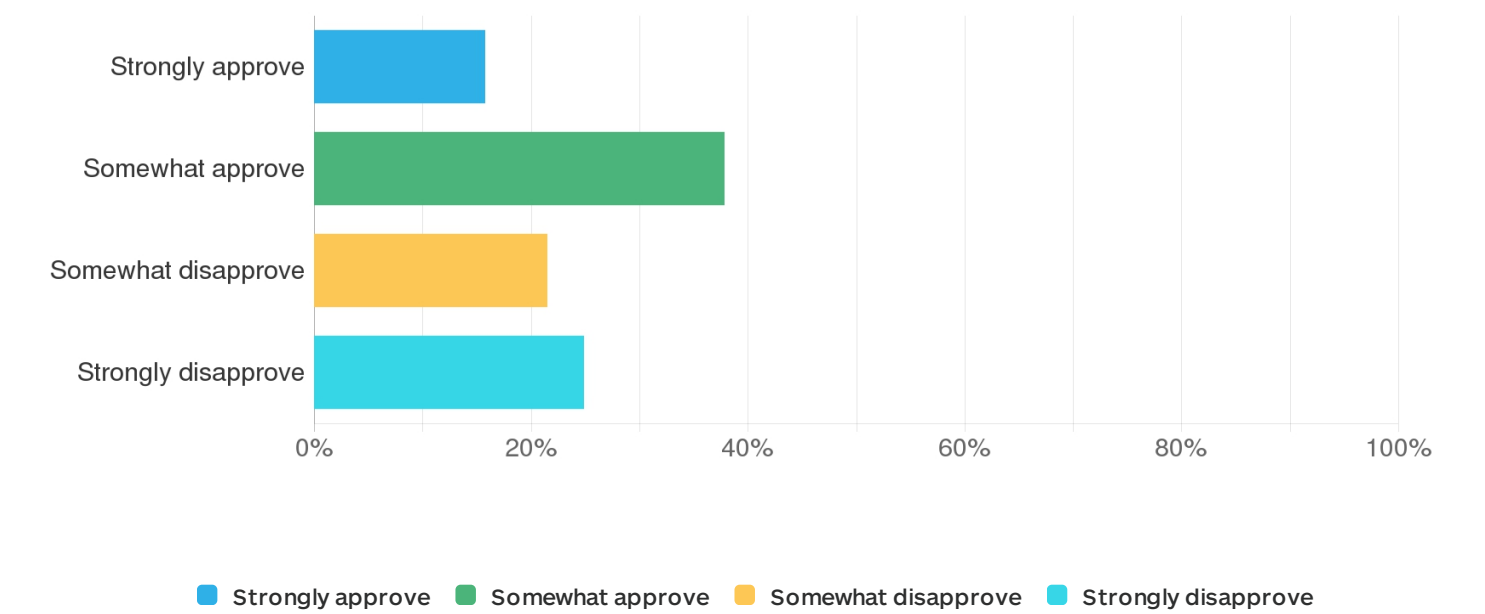

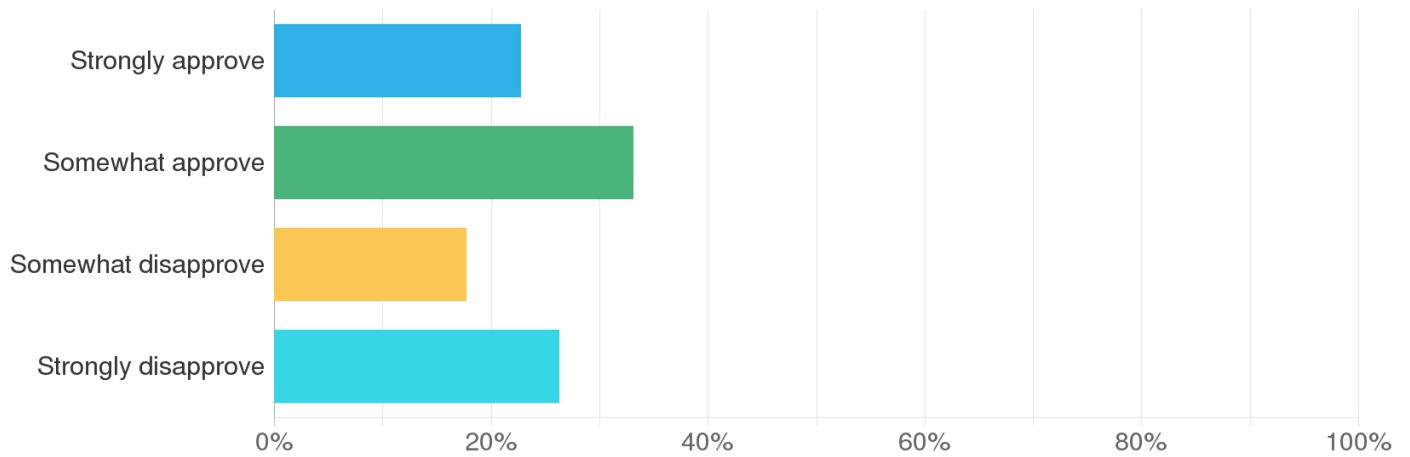

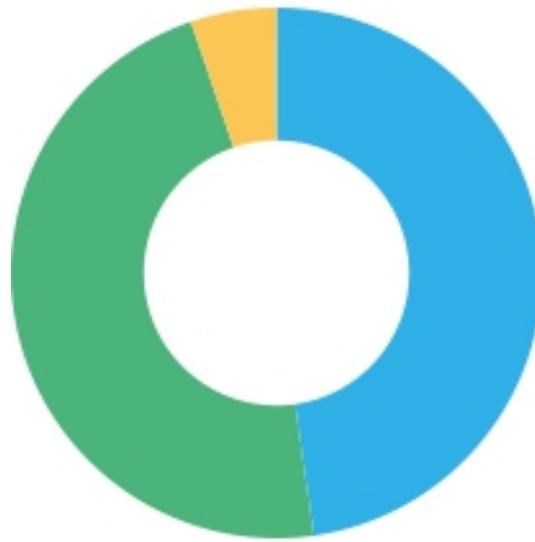

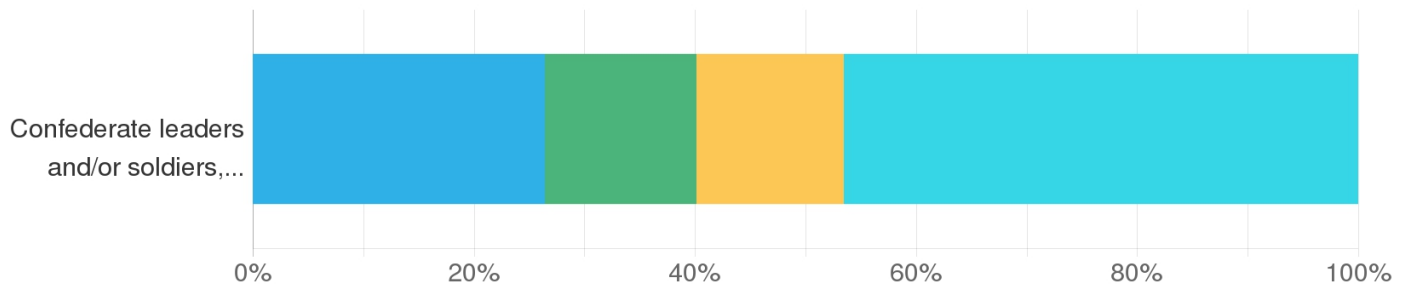

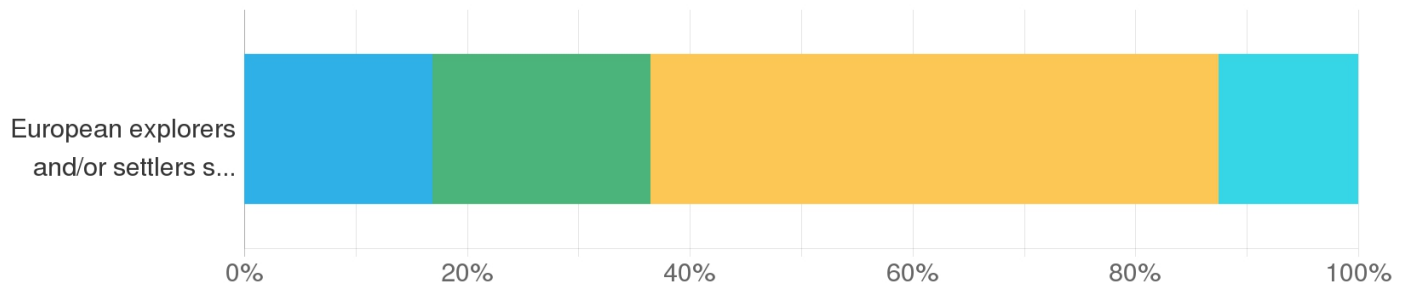

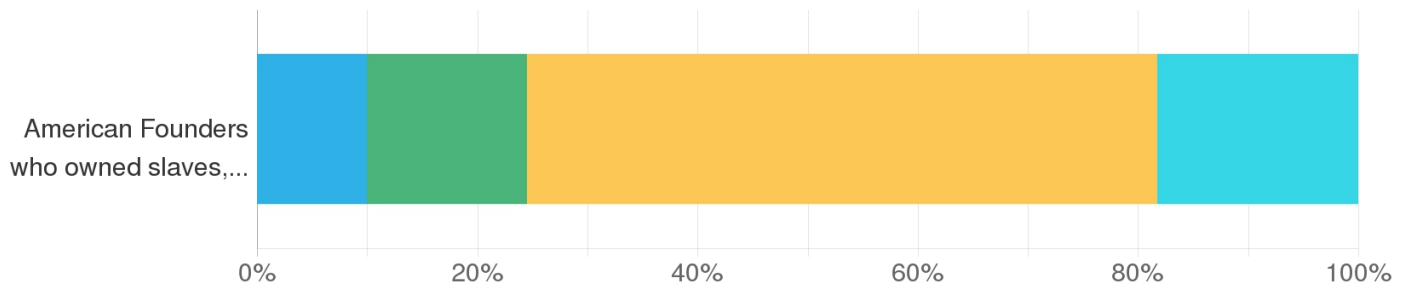

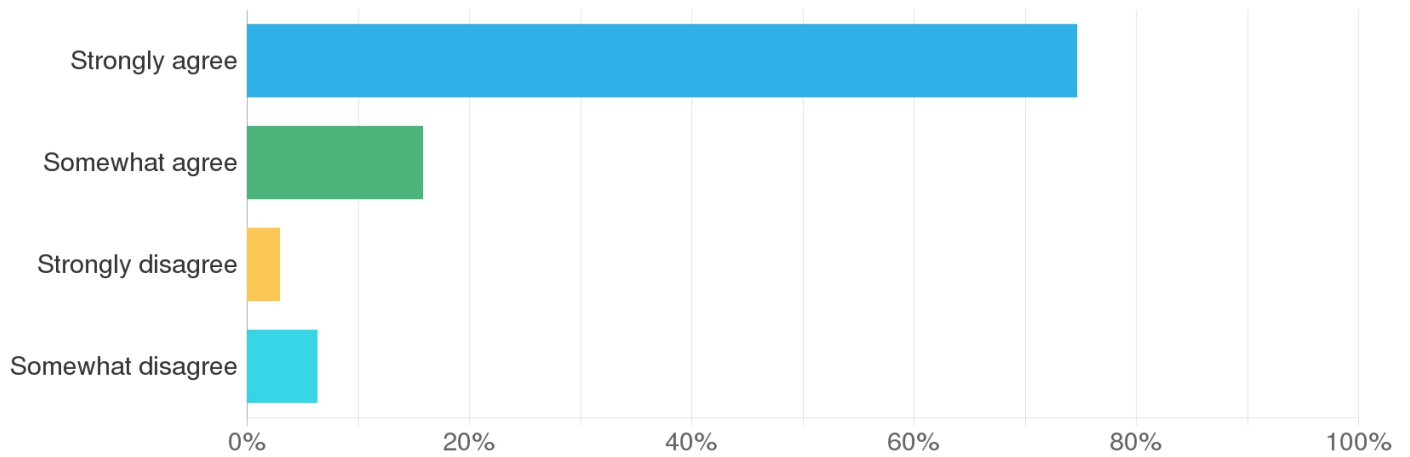

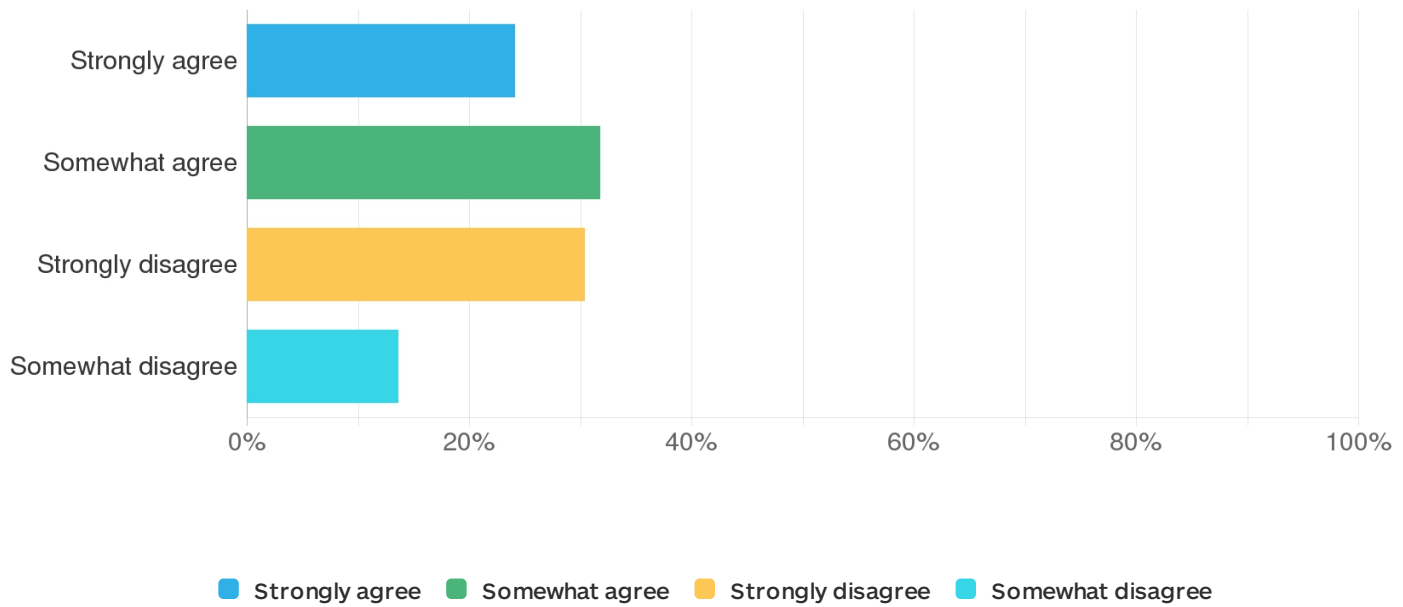

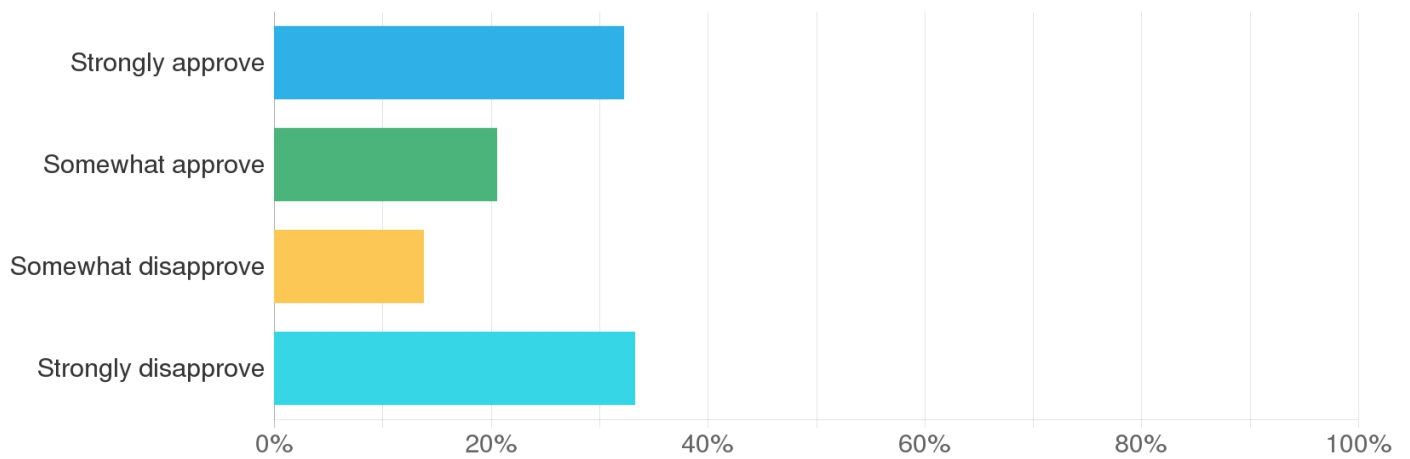

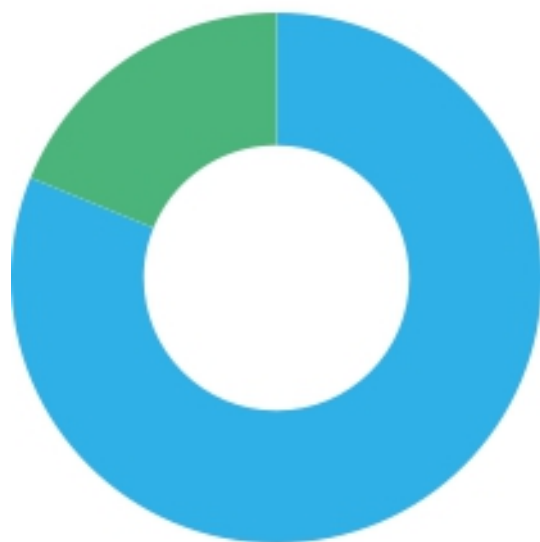

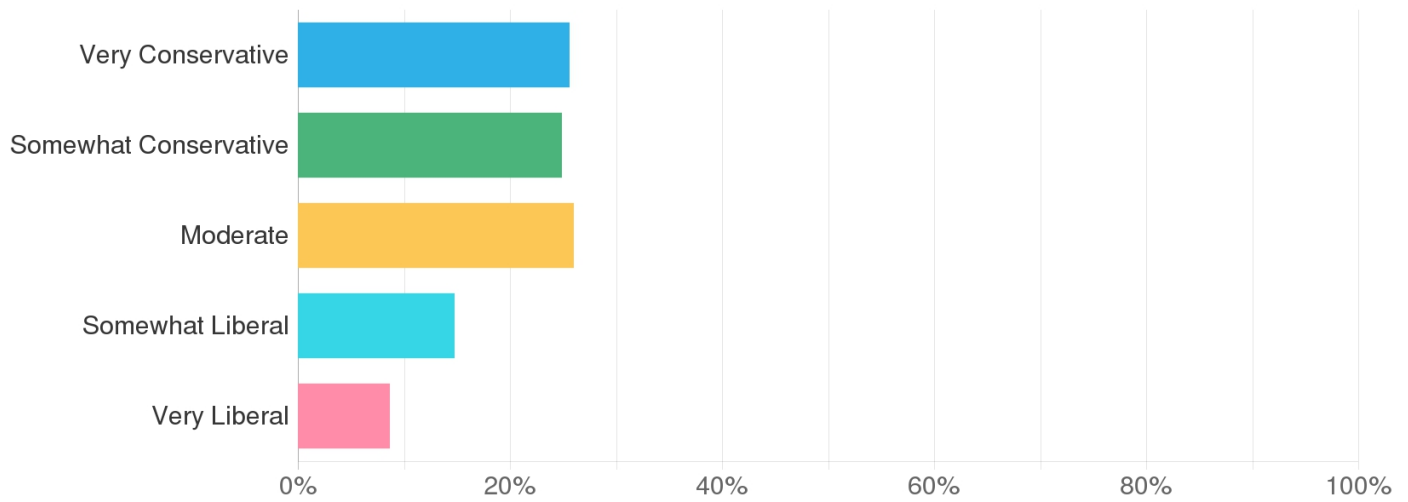

Do you consider yourself to be Very conservative, Somewhat Conservative, Moderate, Somewhat Liberal or Very Liberal?

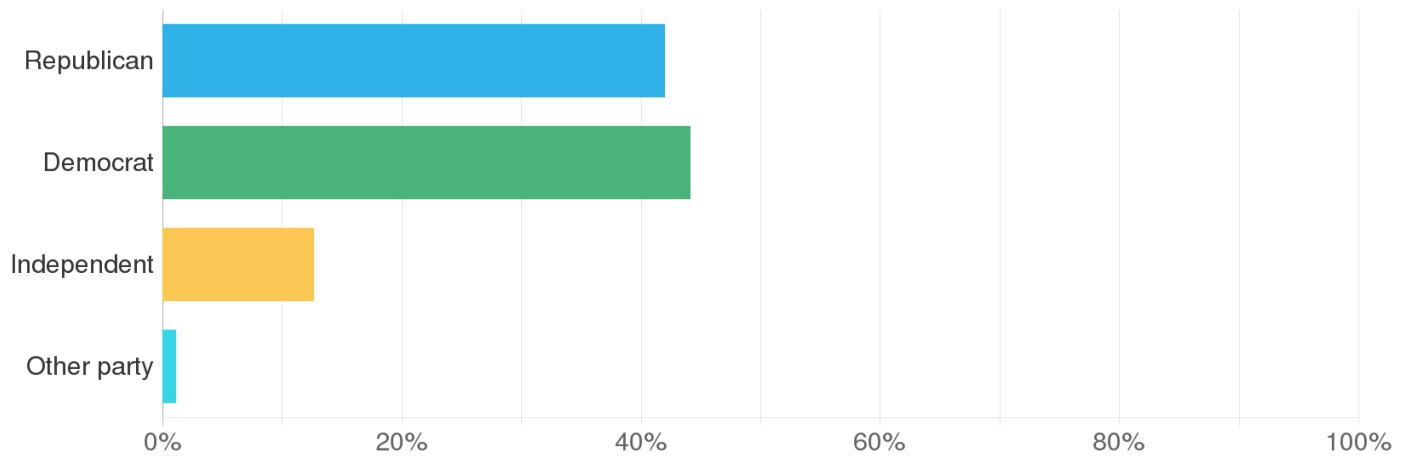

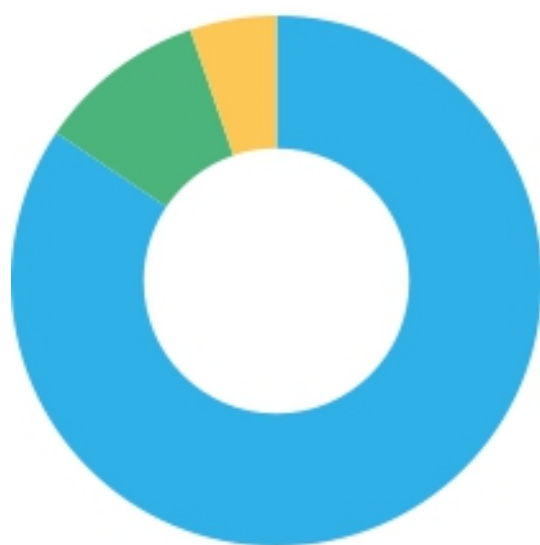

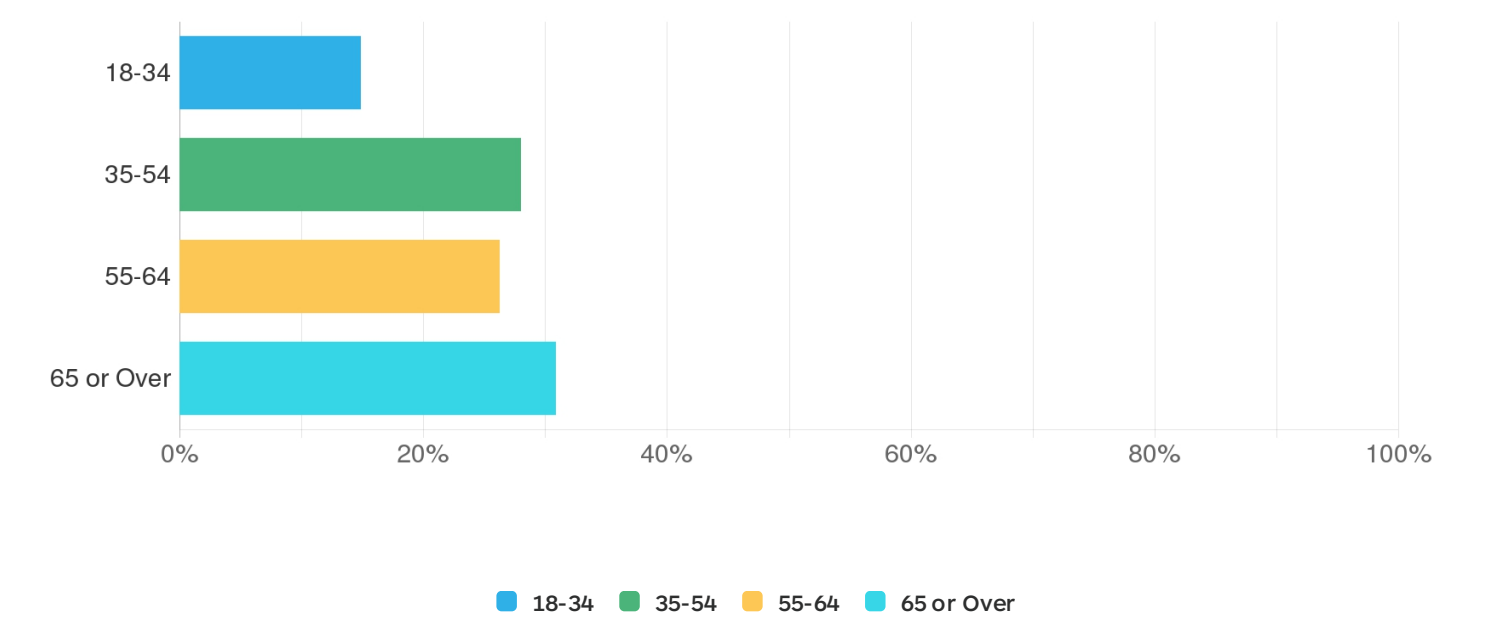

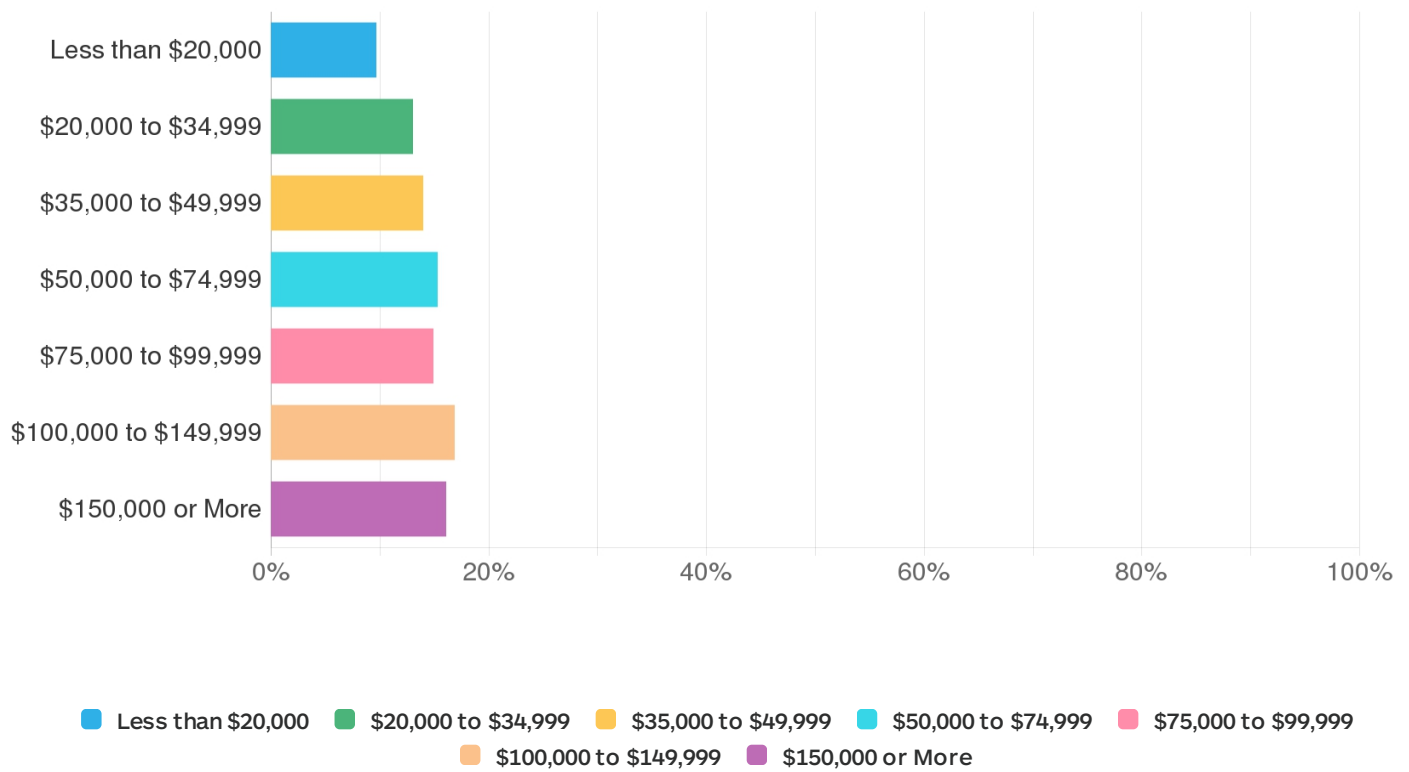

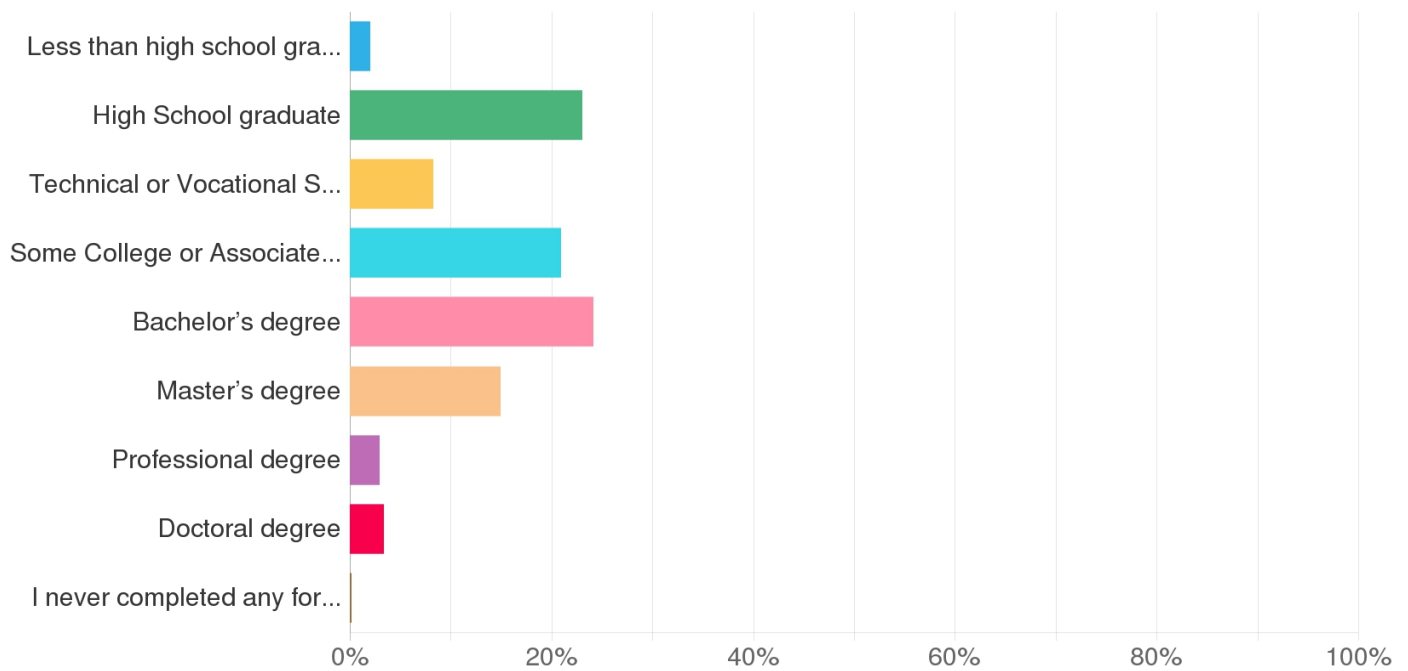
What is your total household income?

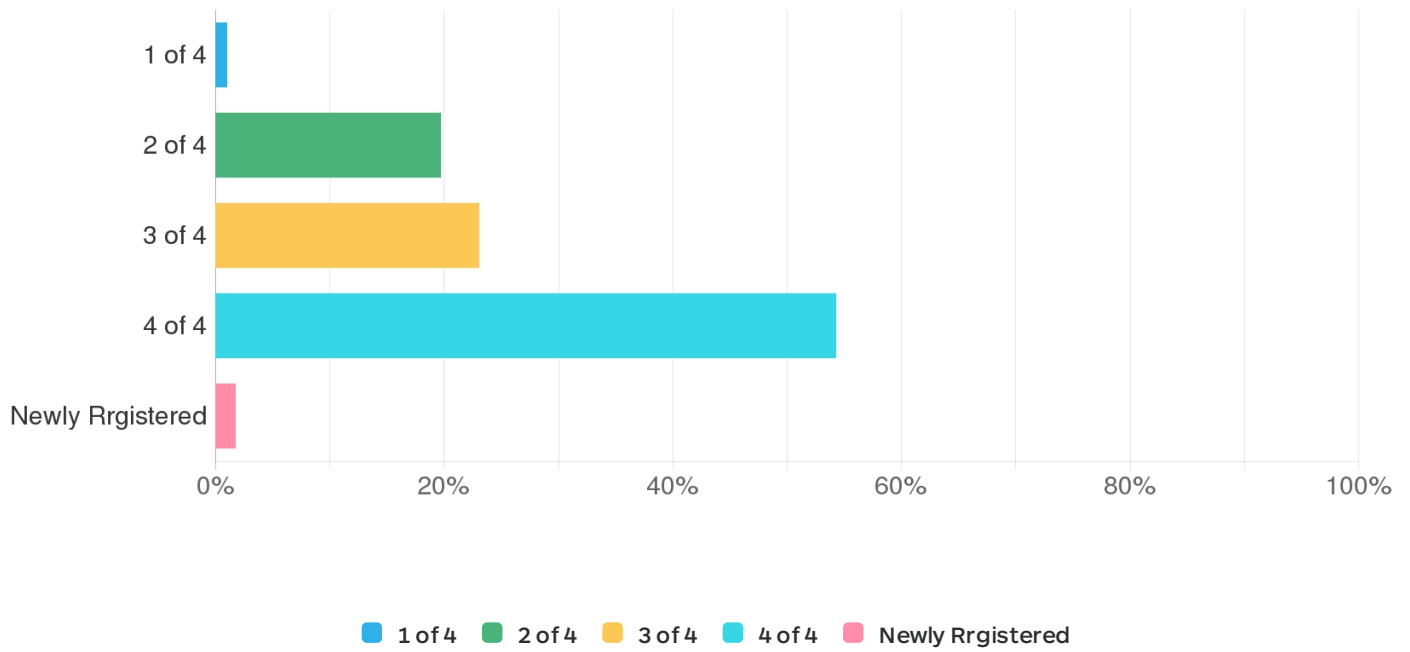

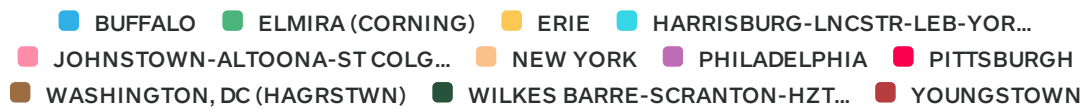
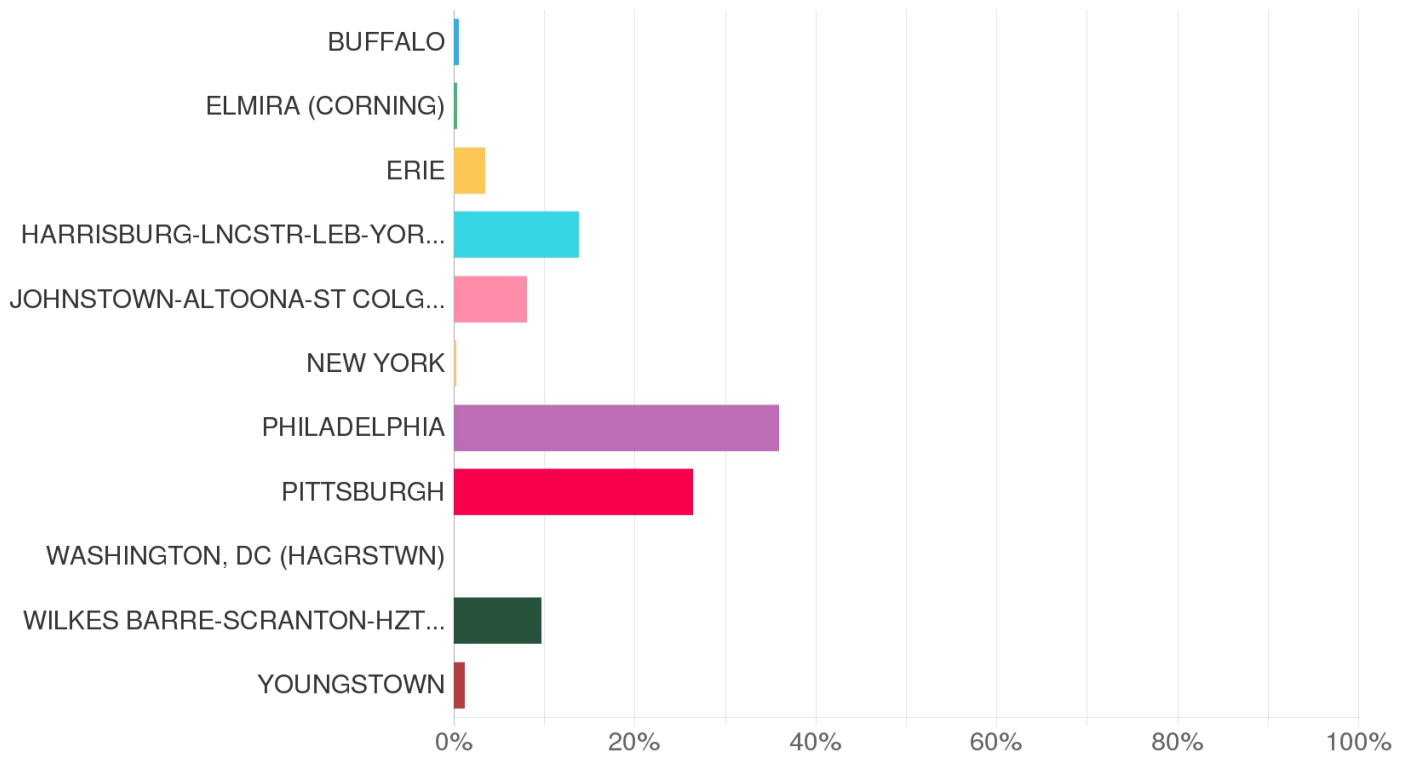
