
**Survey Results** • 07.11.2020 - 07.16.2020

The APP Kentucky General Election Survey was conducted by IVR Interviews and Online Mobile from July 11 - July 16 among a random sample of 600 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.7 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Are you 18 years of age and registered to vote in the state of Kentucky?



How likely are you to vote in the November 3rd General Election in Kentucky? Would you say you are extremely likely, somewhat likely, or not very likely?






















































