The Indiana Public Opinion Survey was conducted by Online Mobile and Online Panel Interviews from March 28 - April 3 among a random sample of 1012 likely 2022 voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

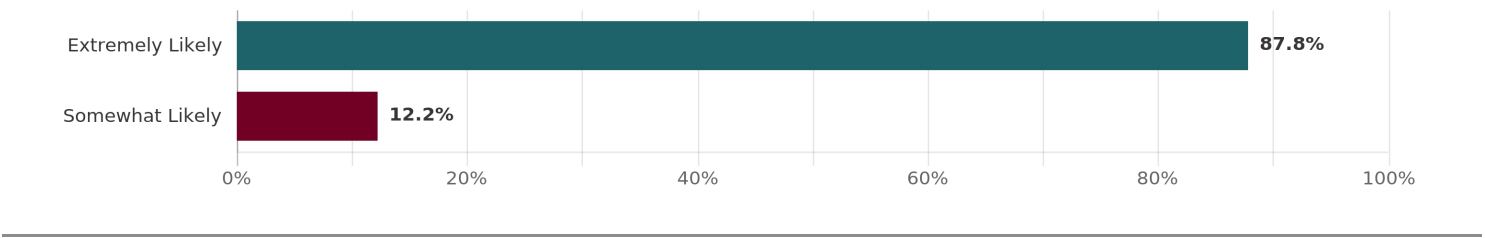

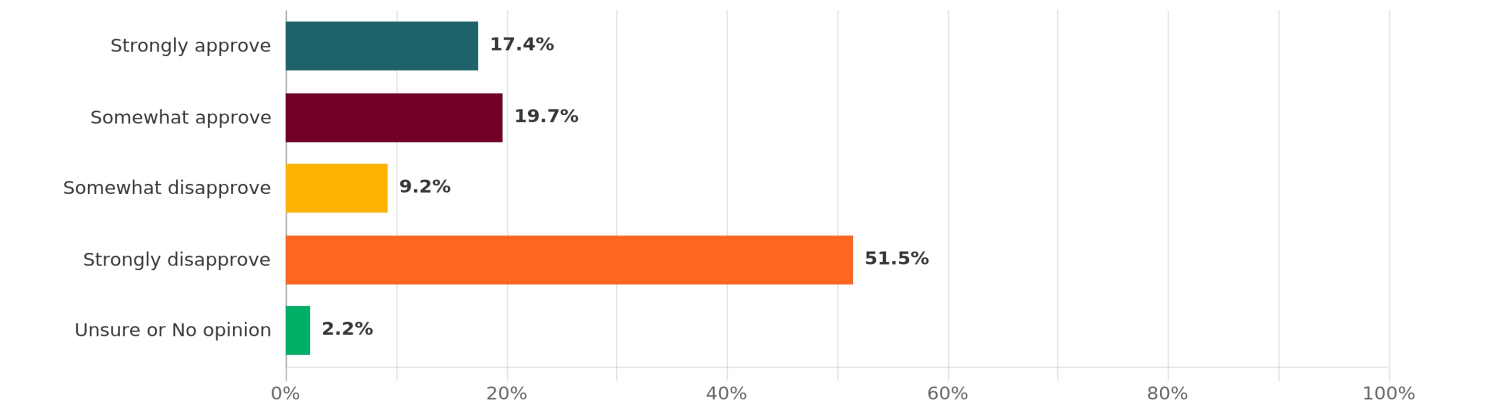

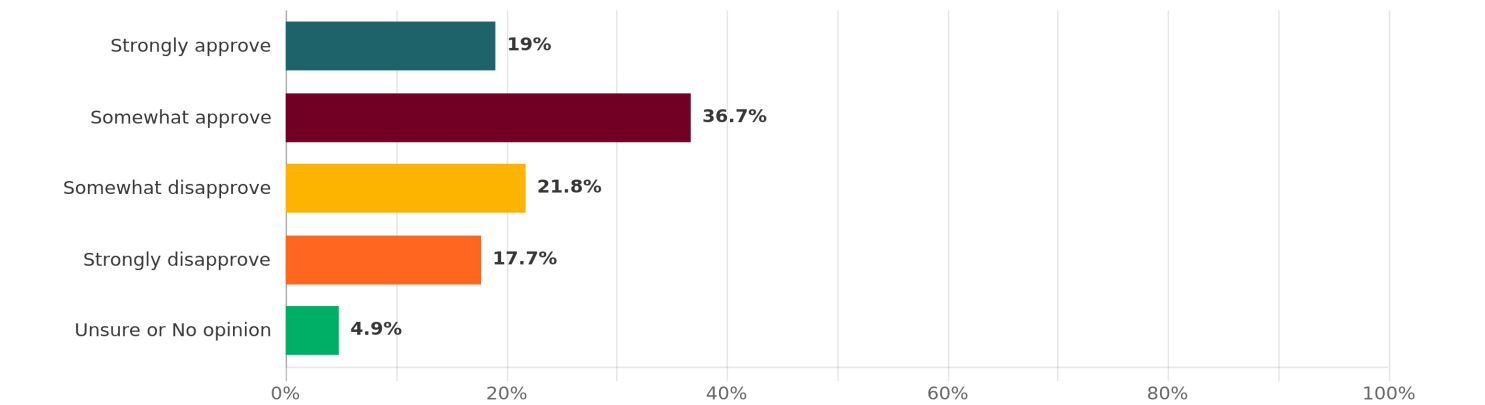

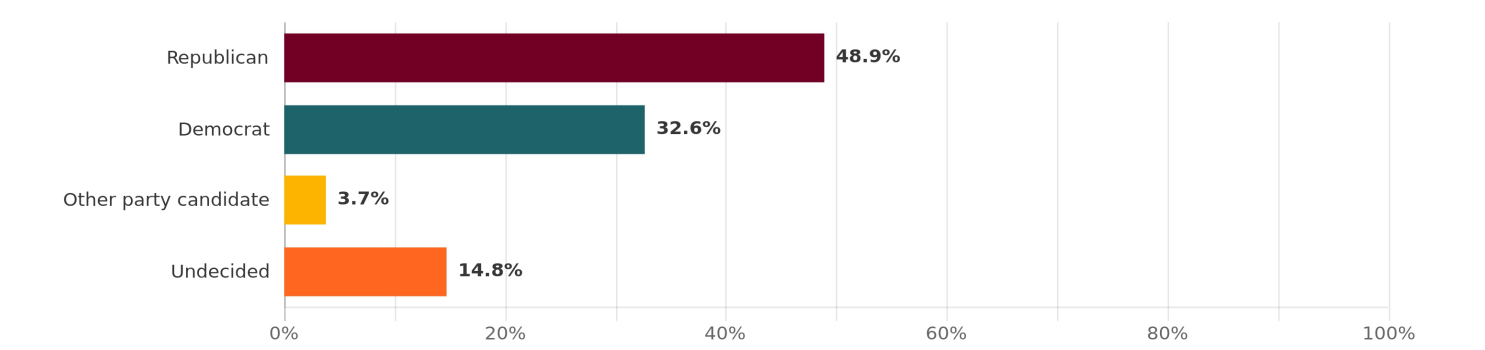

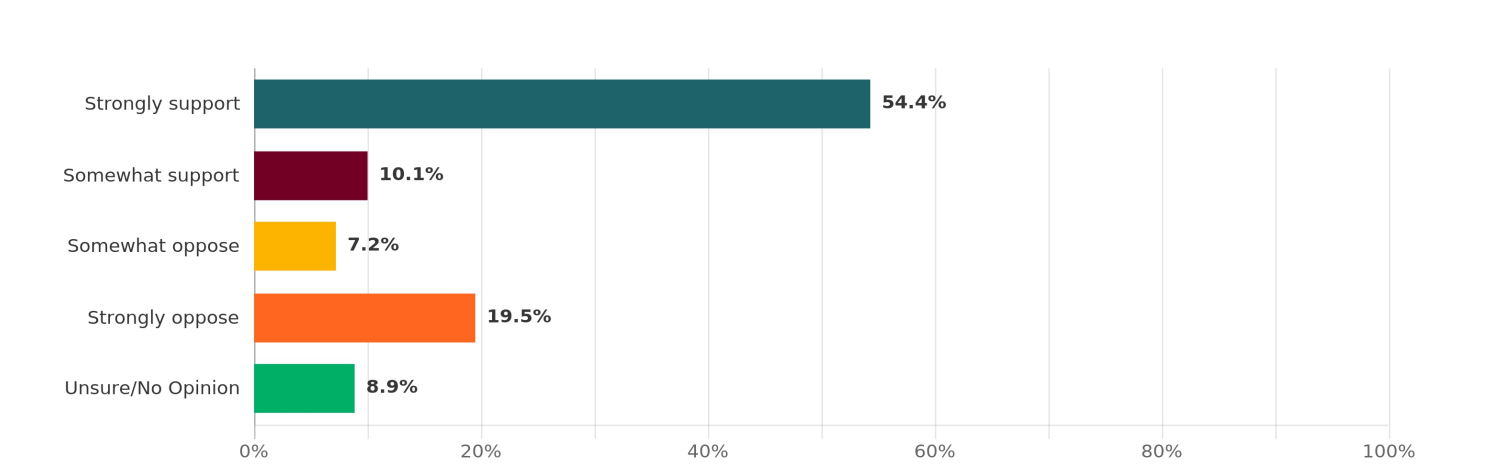

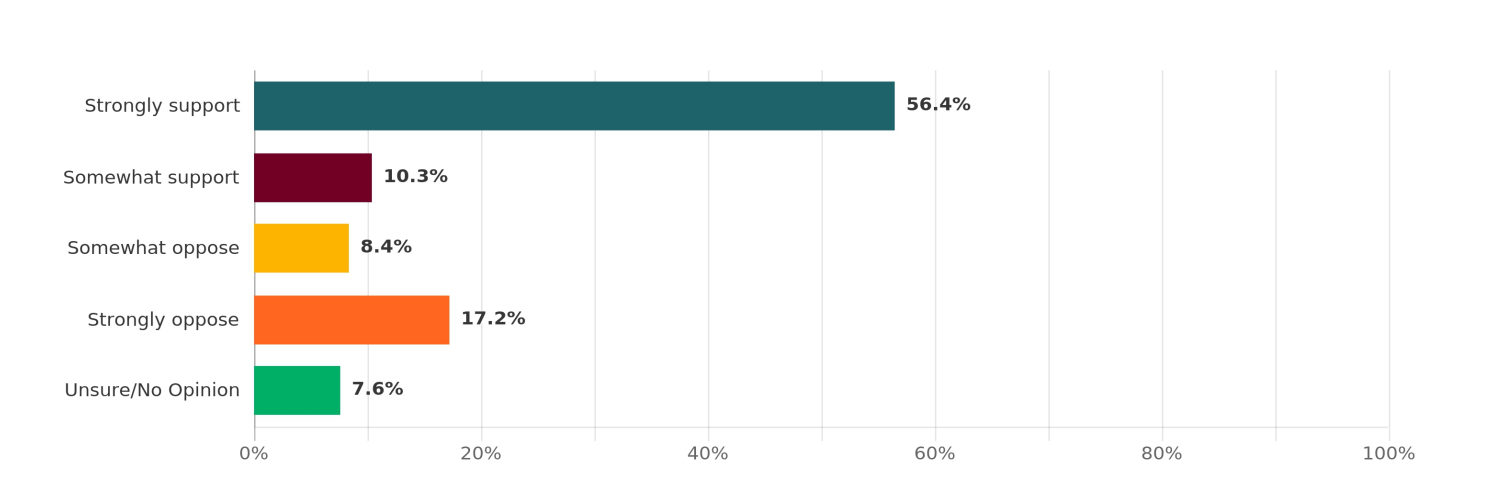

Would you support legislation that banned biologically male students that identify as transgender women from competing in women’s sports programs at Indiana colleges?

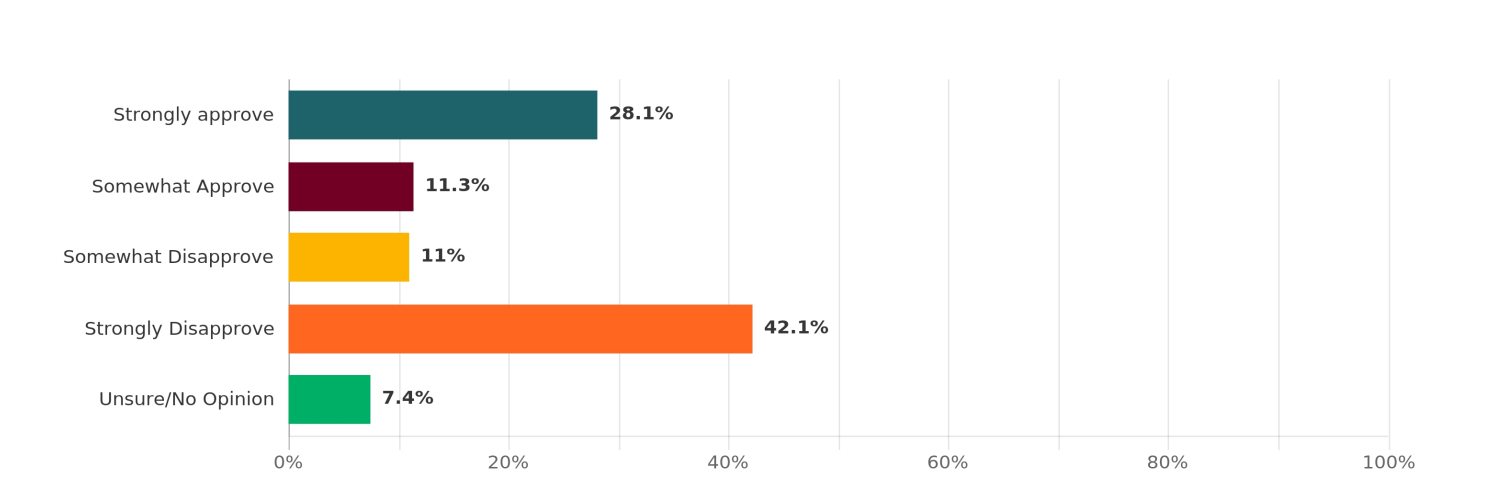

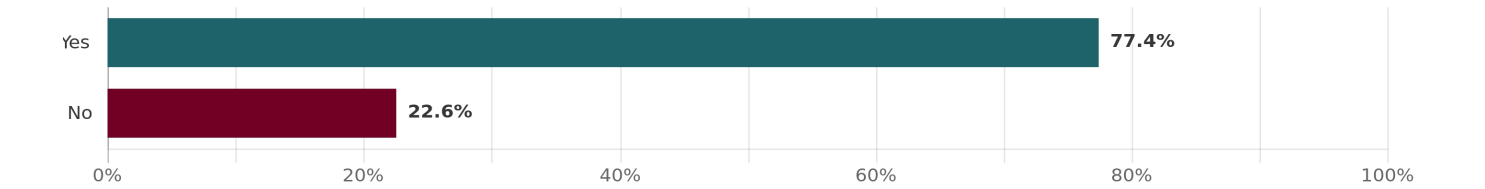

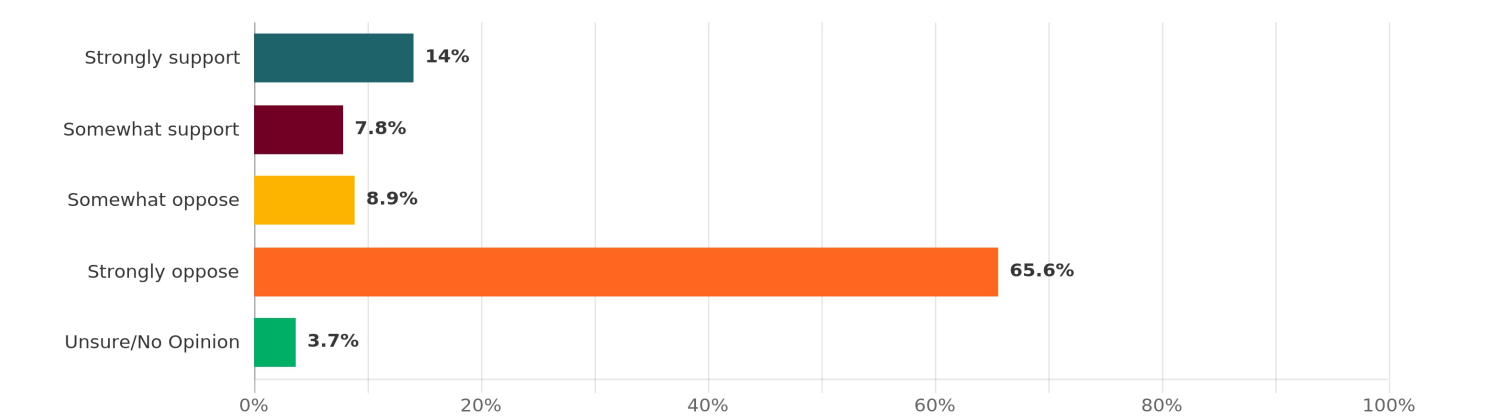

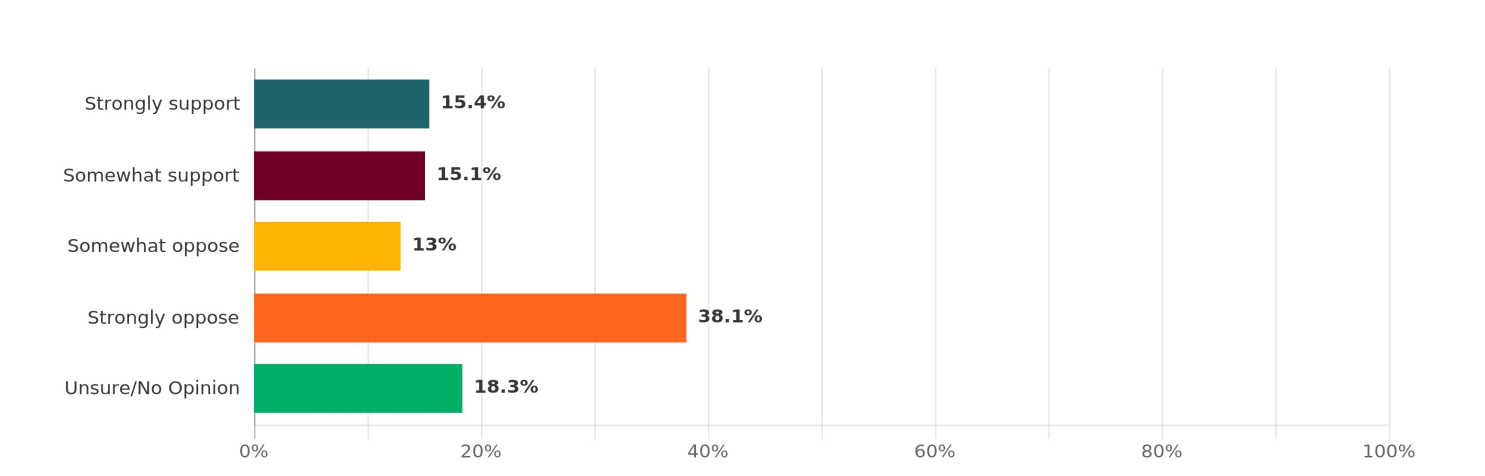

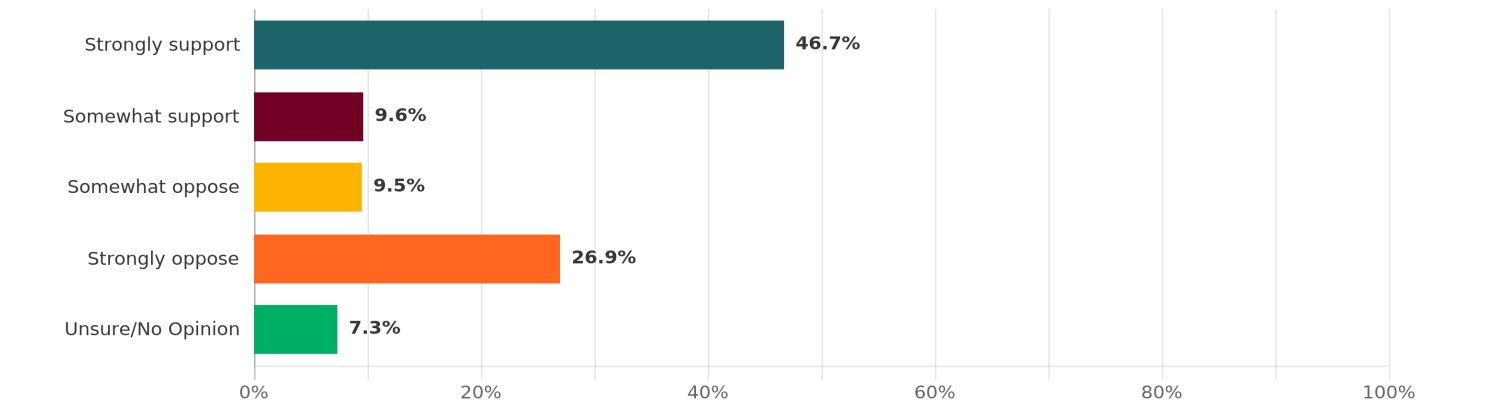

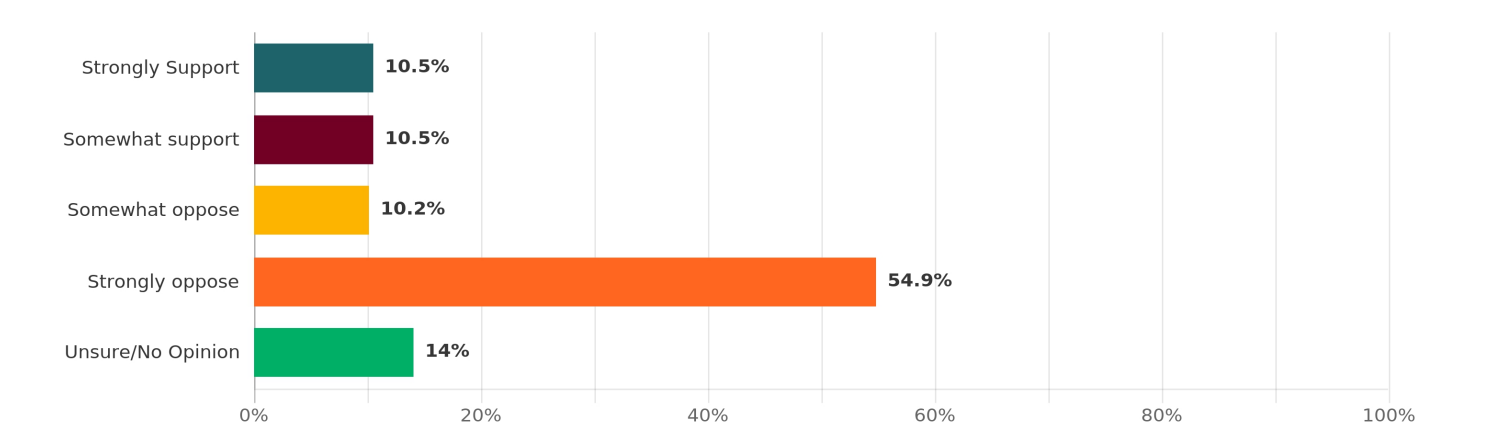

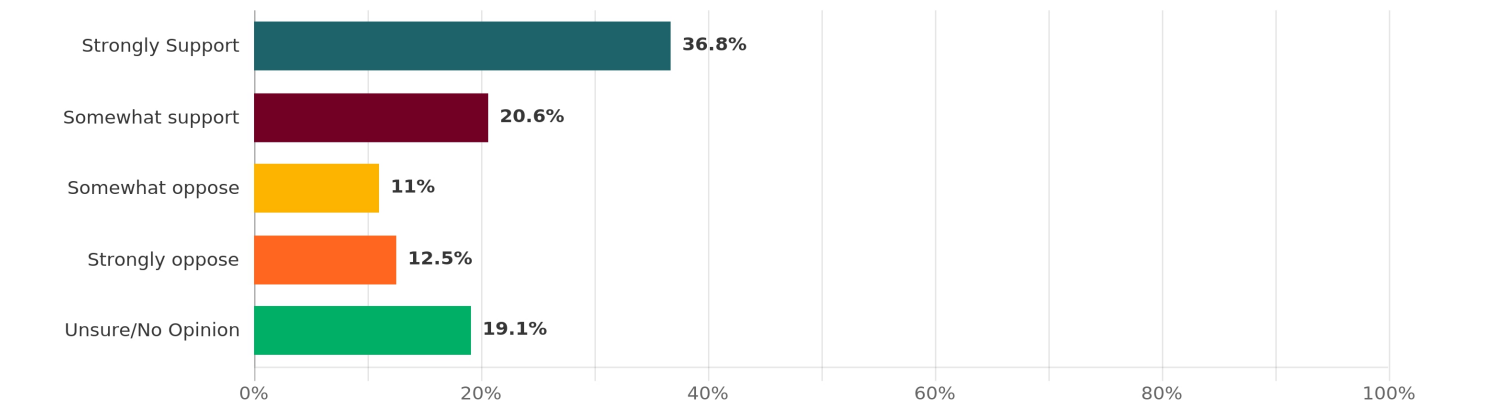

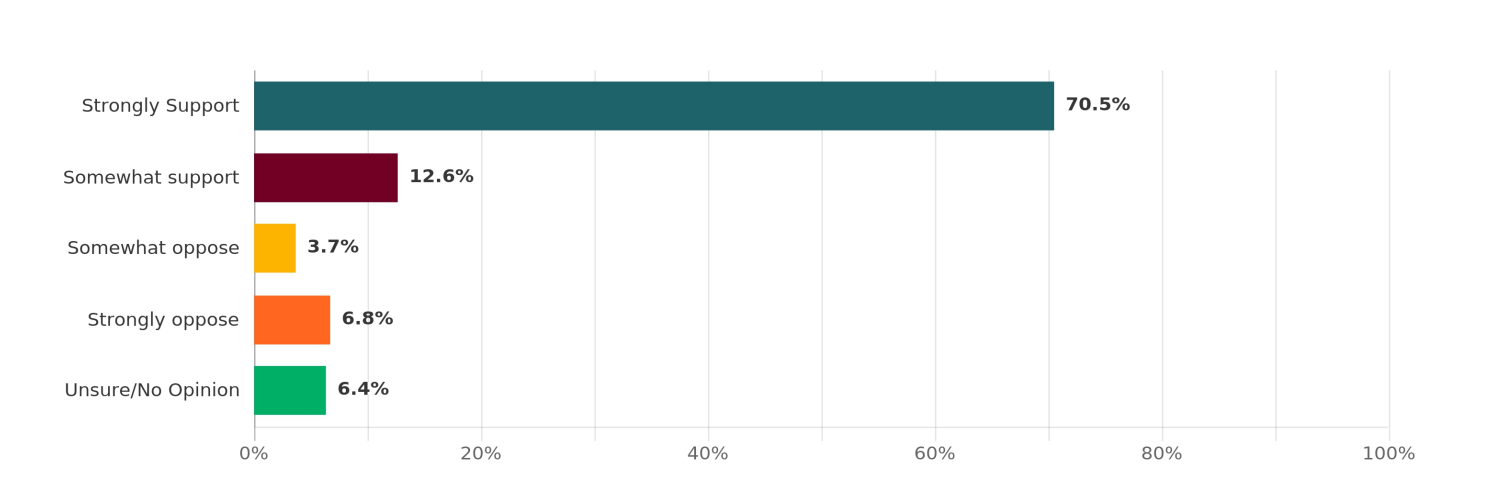

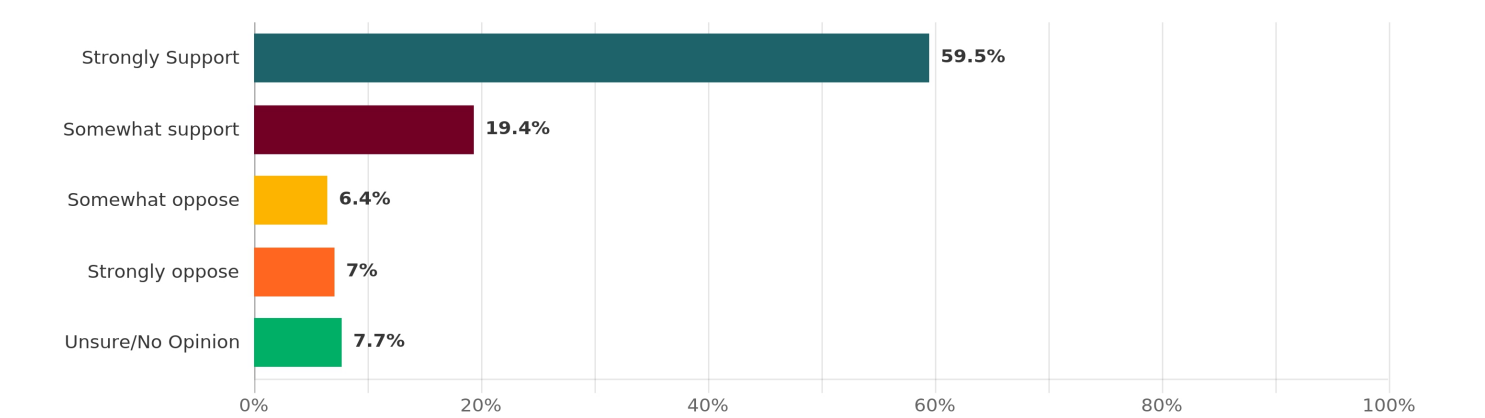

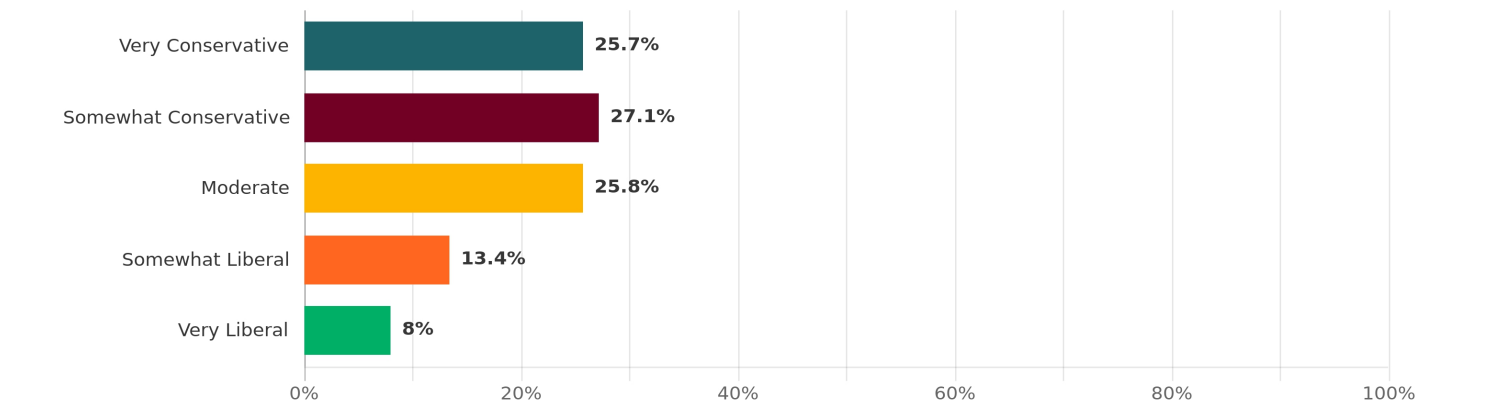

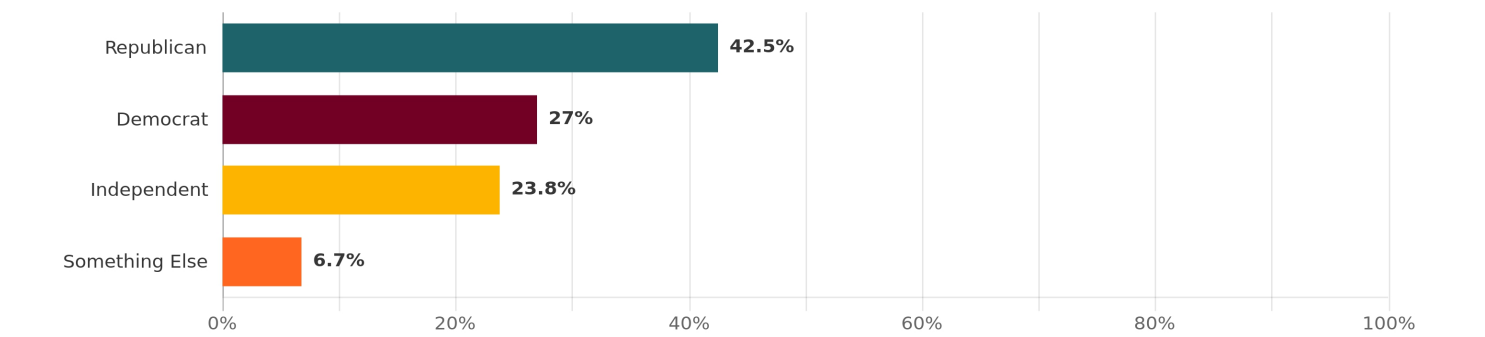

Do you consider yourself to be a Republican, a Democrat, an Independent or something else?

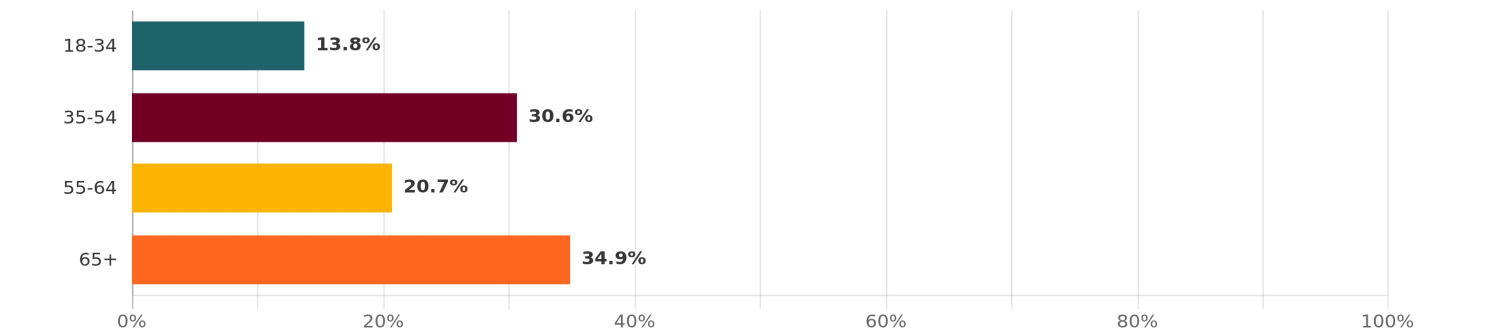

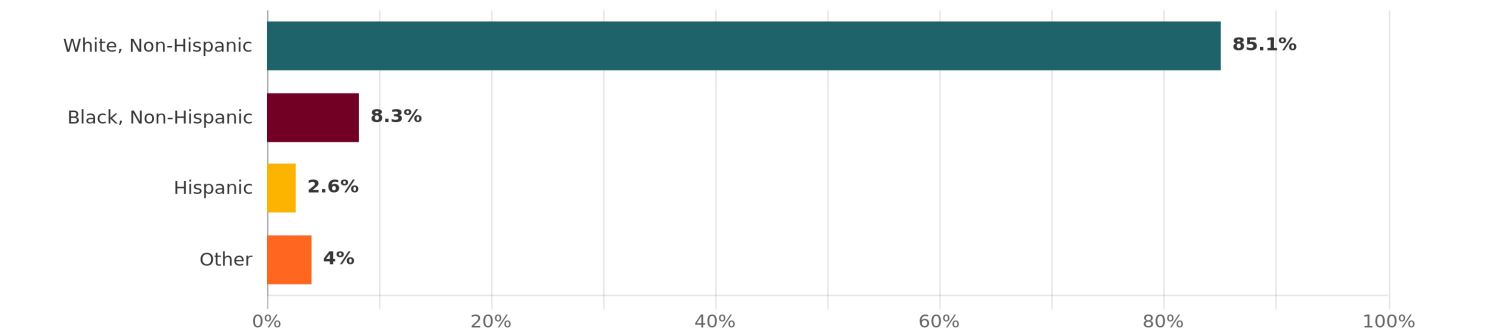
Which of the following is your age range?

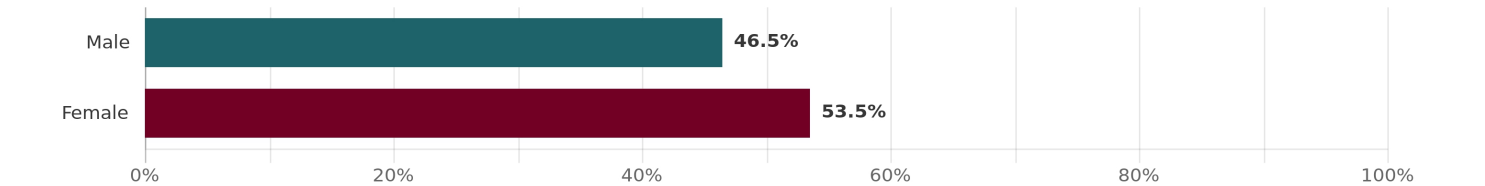
What is your Race or Ethnicity?
