

The APP Michigan General Election Survey was conducted by IVR Interviews and Online Mobile from July 11 - July 16 among a random sample of 700 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.7 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Are you 18 years of age and registered to vote in the state of Michigan?



How likely are you to vote in the November 3rd General Election in Michigan? Would you say you are extremely likely, somewhat likely, or not very likely?





















If you learned Black Lives Matter supported doing away with the traditional family, would you be more or less likely to support Black Lives Matter?



If you learned Black Lives Matter supported defunding police departments nationwide, would you be more or less likely to support Black Lives Matter?





Should children who say they identify as transgender be allowed to undergo physical sex change surgeries or chemical treatments while they are under the age of 18?



Should online pornography distributors be required by law to verify the age of users who access their content in order to help prevent children under the age of 18 from viewing obscene material?






### Q19: Ideology

Do you consider yourself to be Very conservative, Somewhat Conservative, Moderate, Somewhat Liberal or Very Liberal?








What is your ethnicity? Are you....


**Q23: Age** What is your age? Are you...






