The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.5 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Are you 18 years of age and registered to vote in the state of Texas?

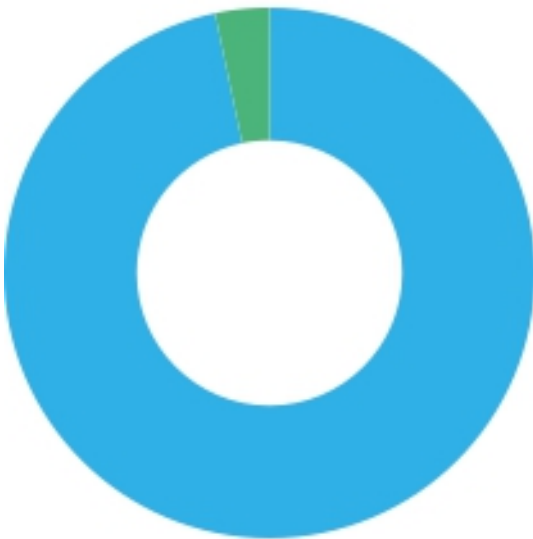

How likely are you to vote in the November 3rd General Election in Texas? Would you say you are extremely likely, somewhat likely, or not very likely?

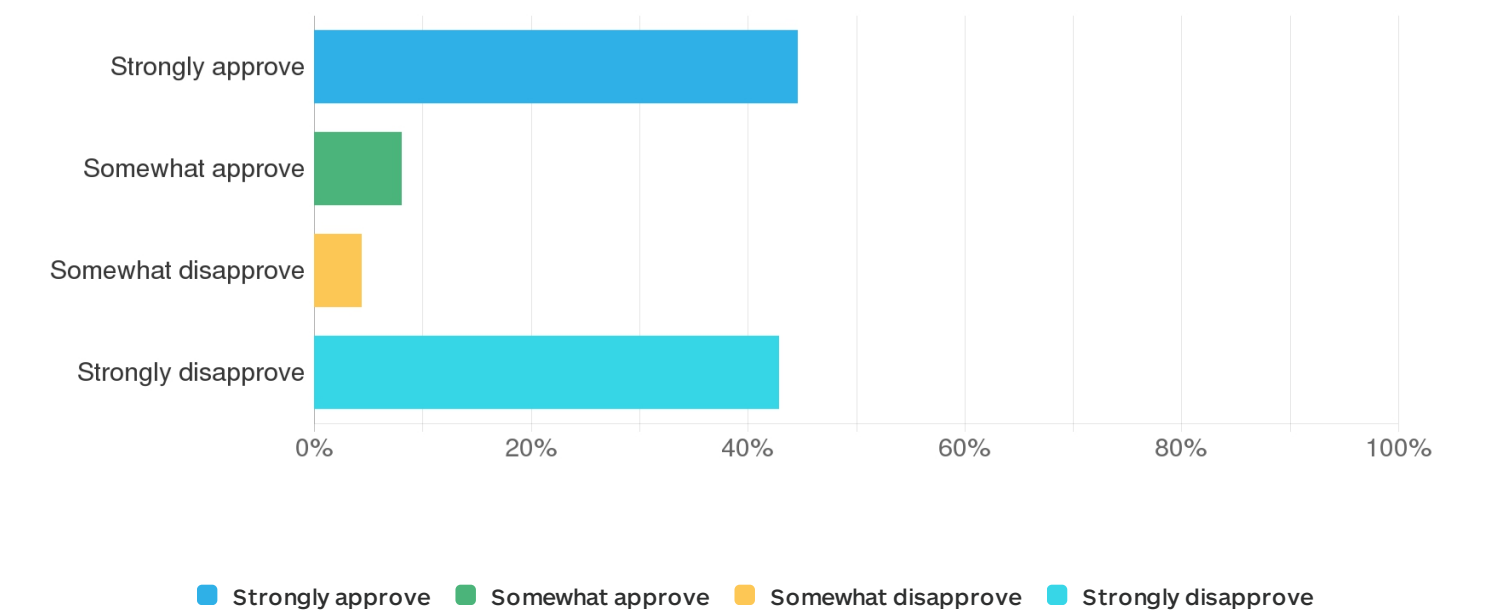

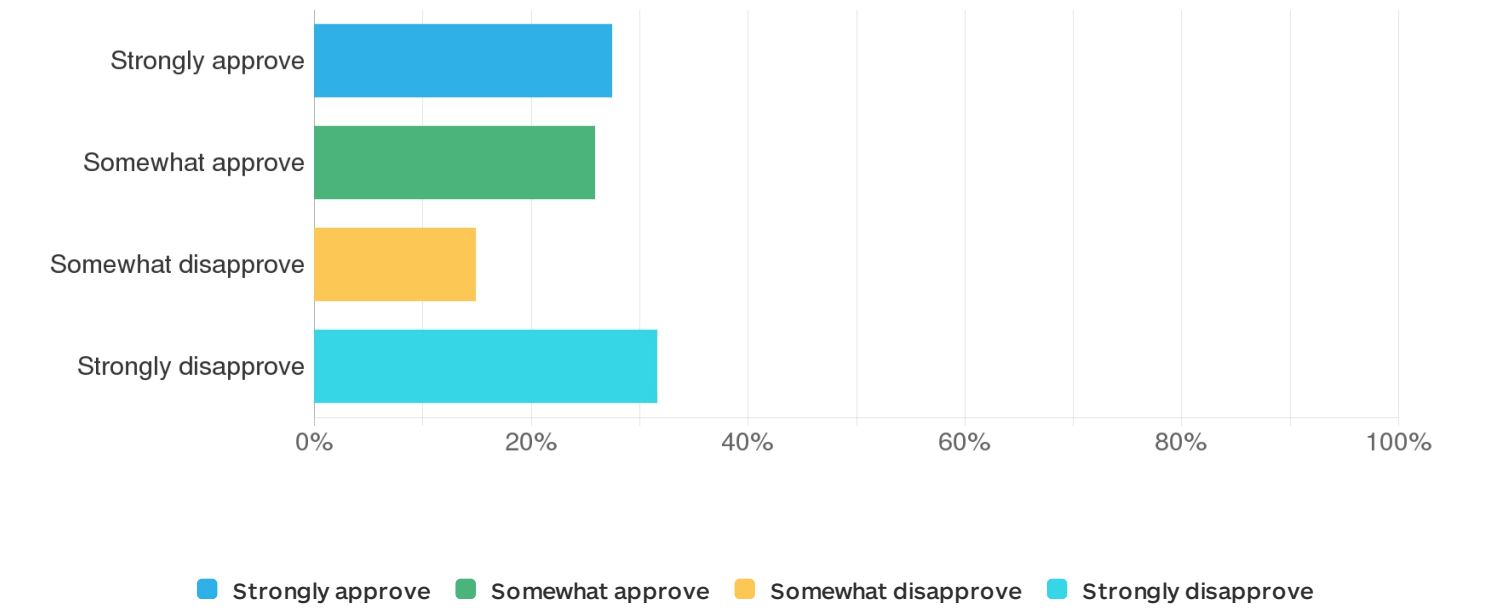

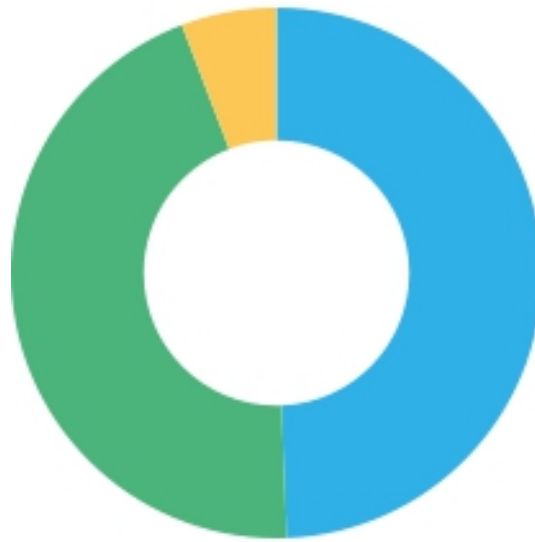

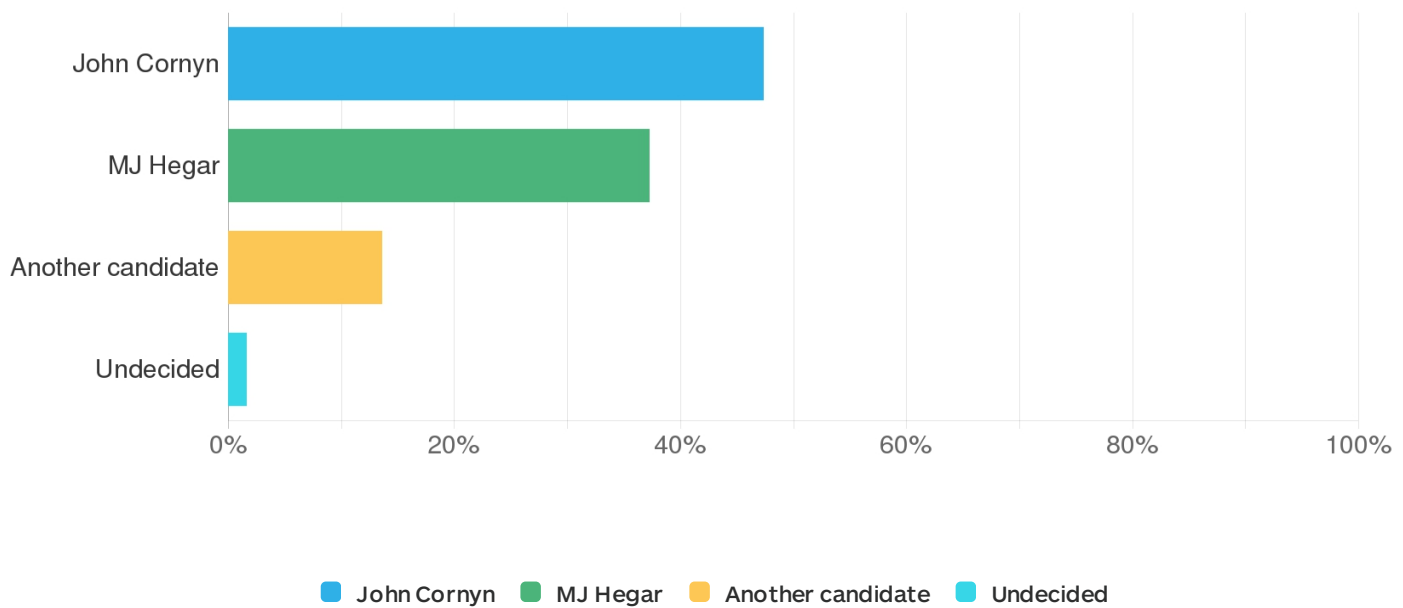

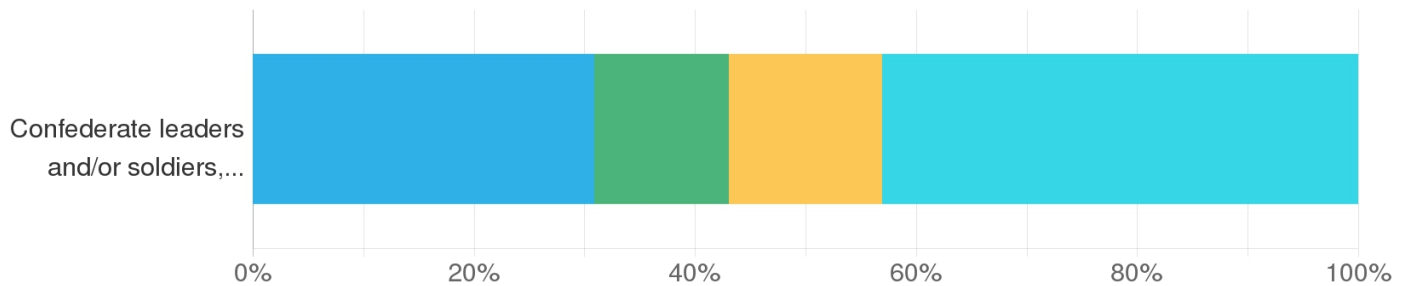

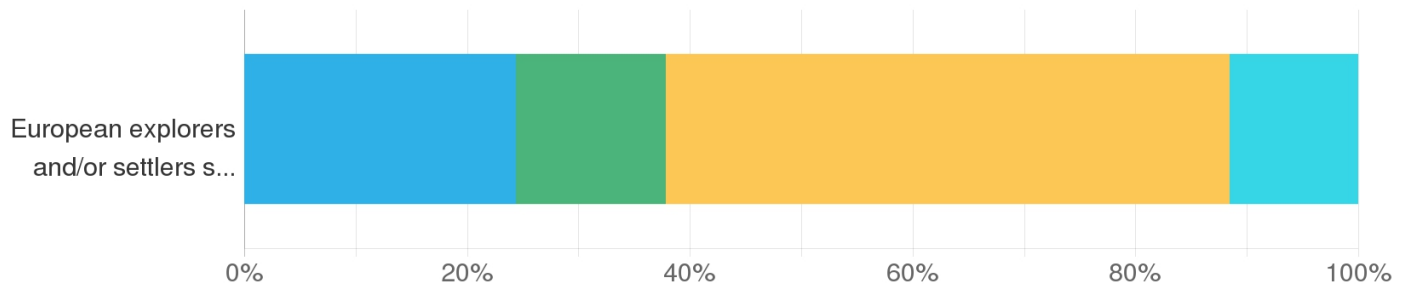

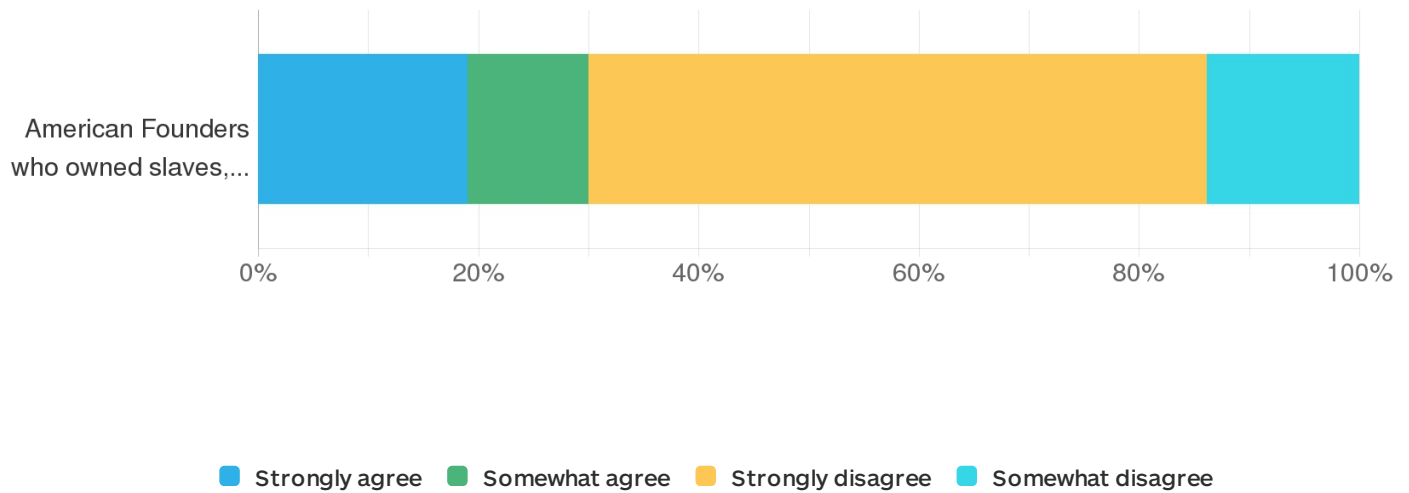

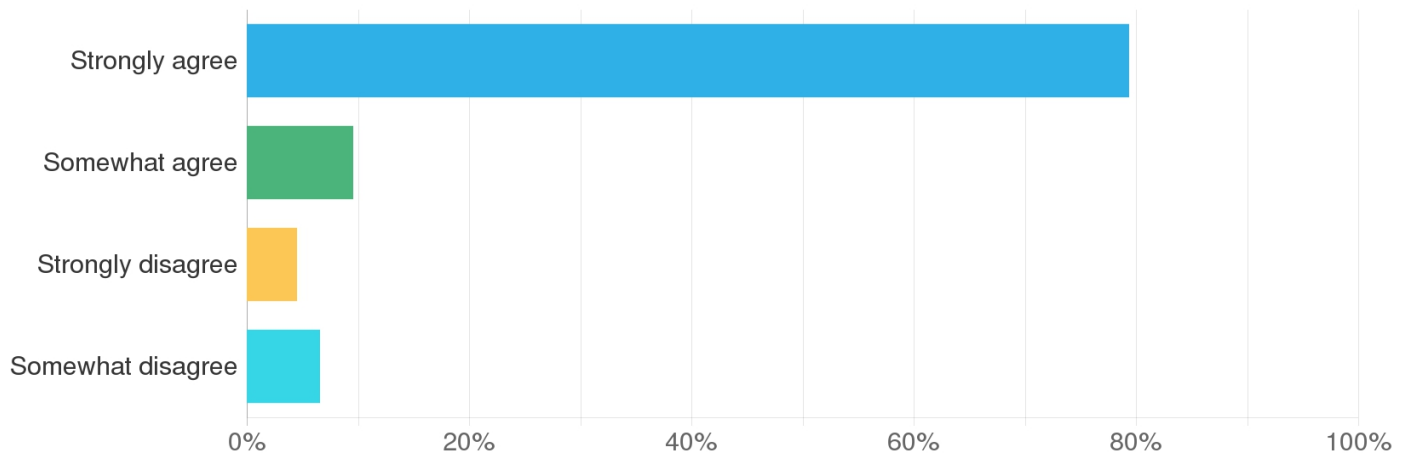

Do you agree or disagree with the following statement? “I am proud to be an American.”

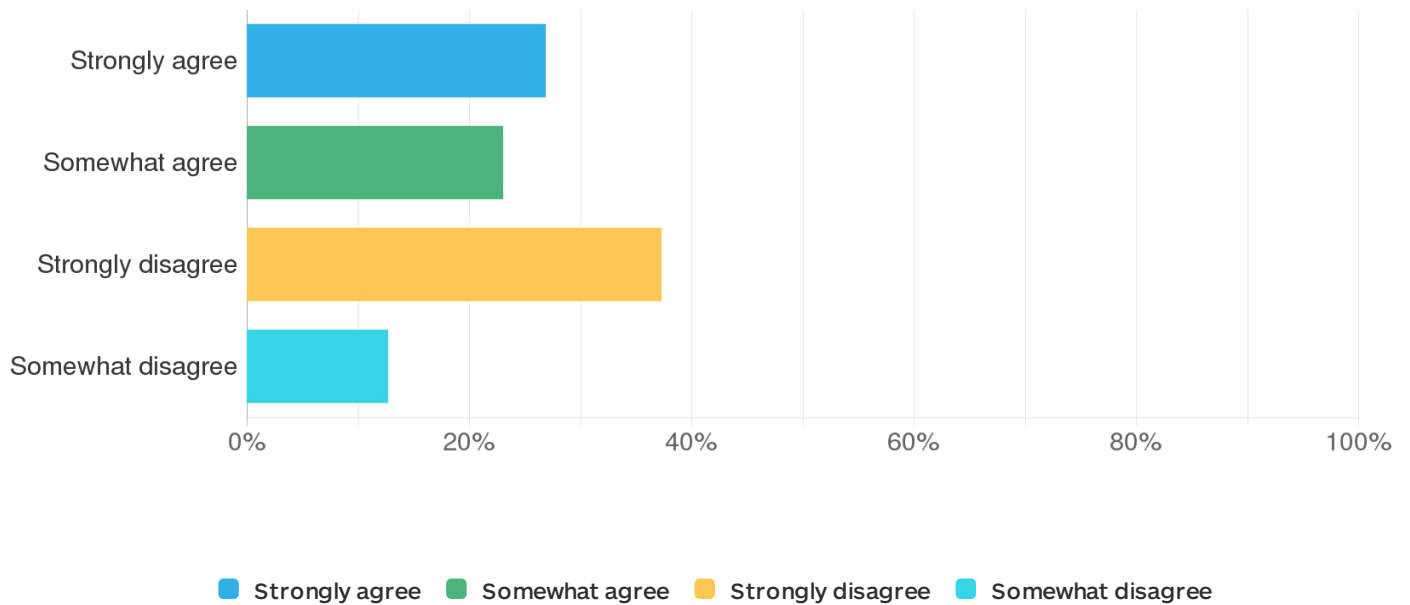

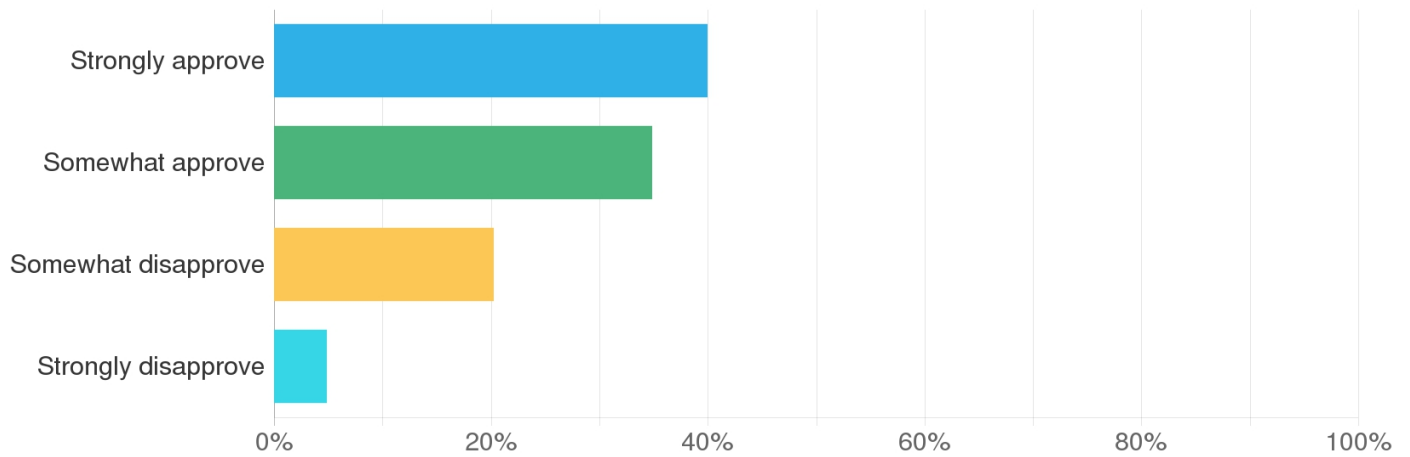

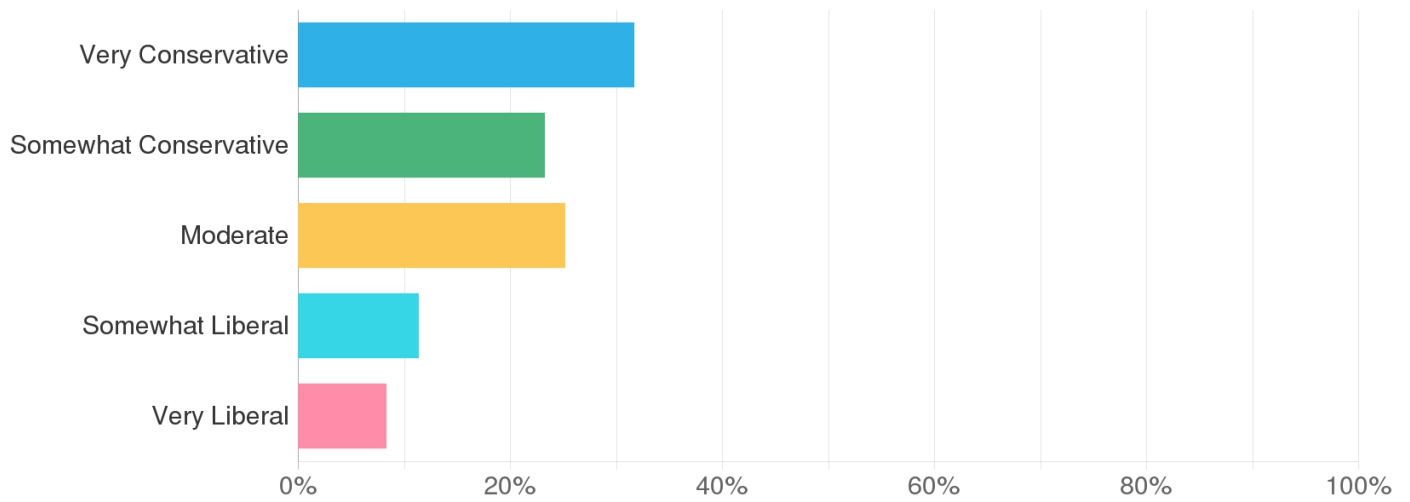

Do you consider yourself to be Very conservative, Somewhat Conservative, Moderate, Somewhat Liberal or Very Liberal?

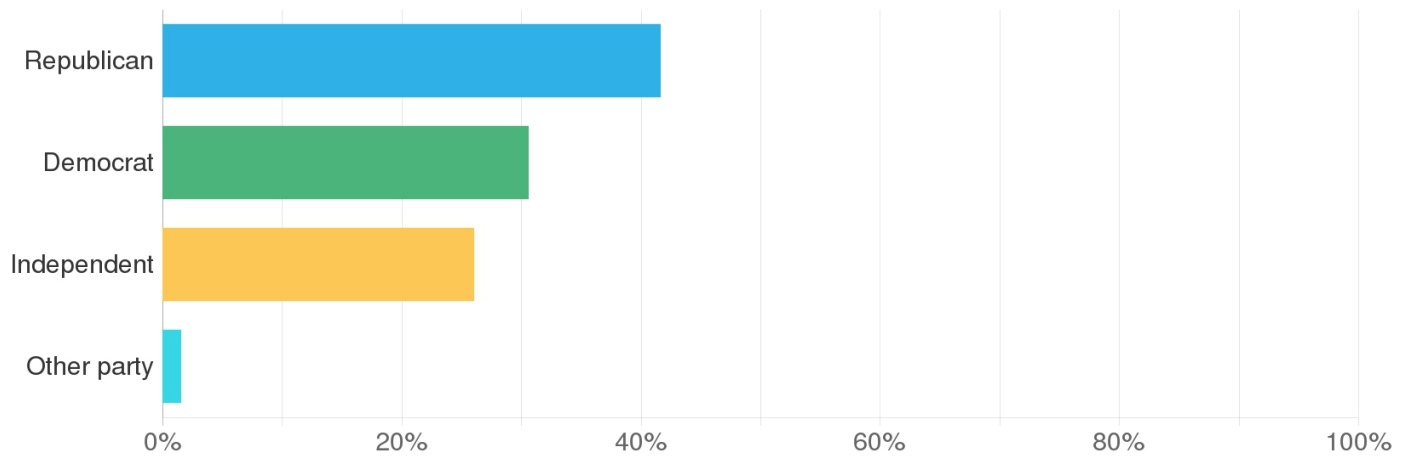

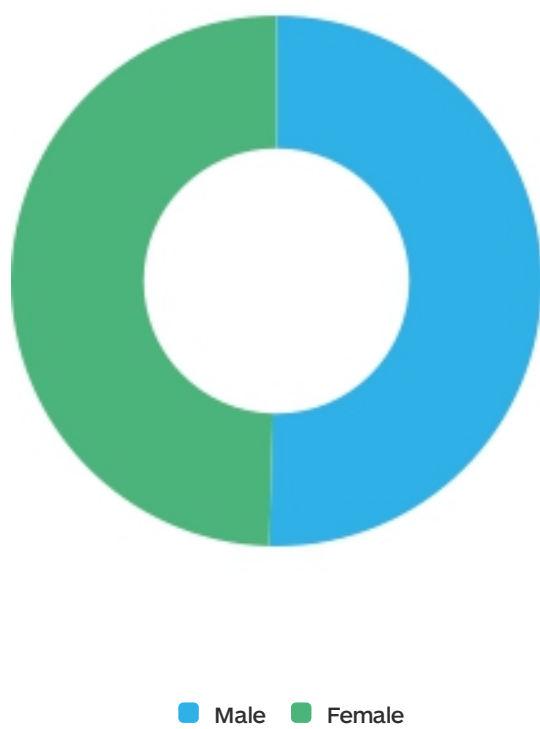

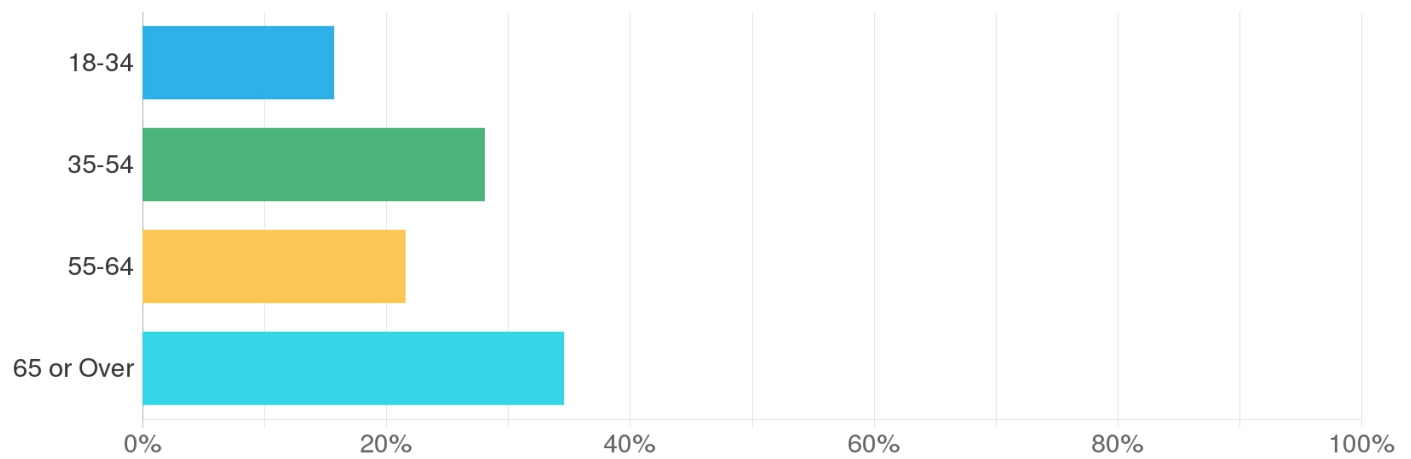

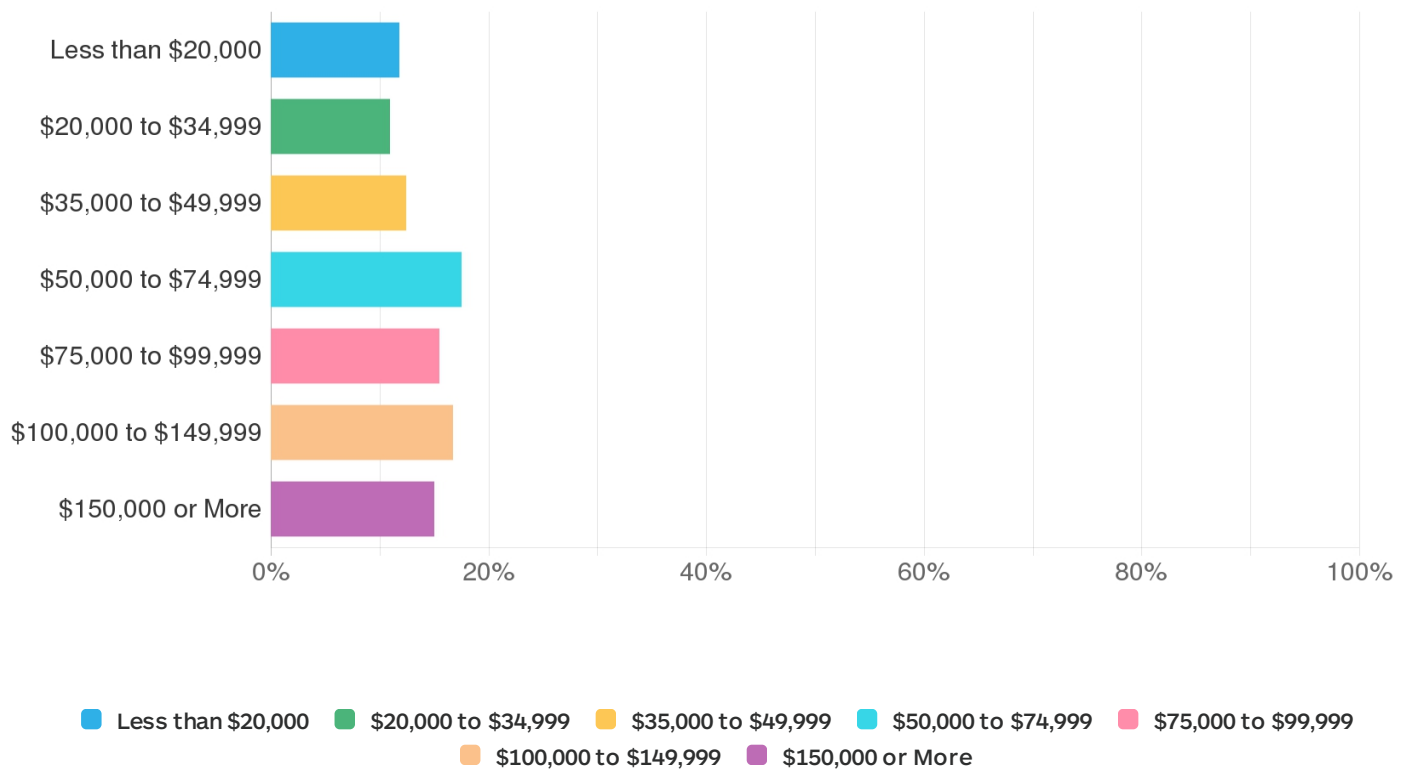

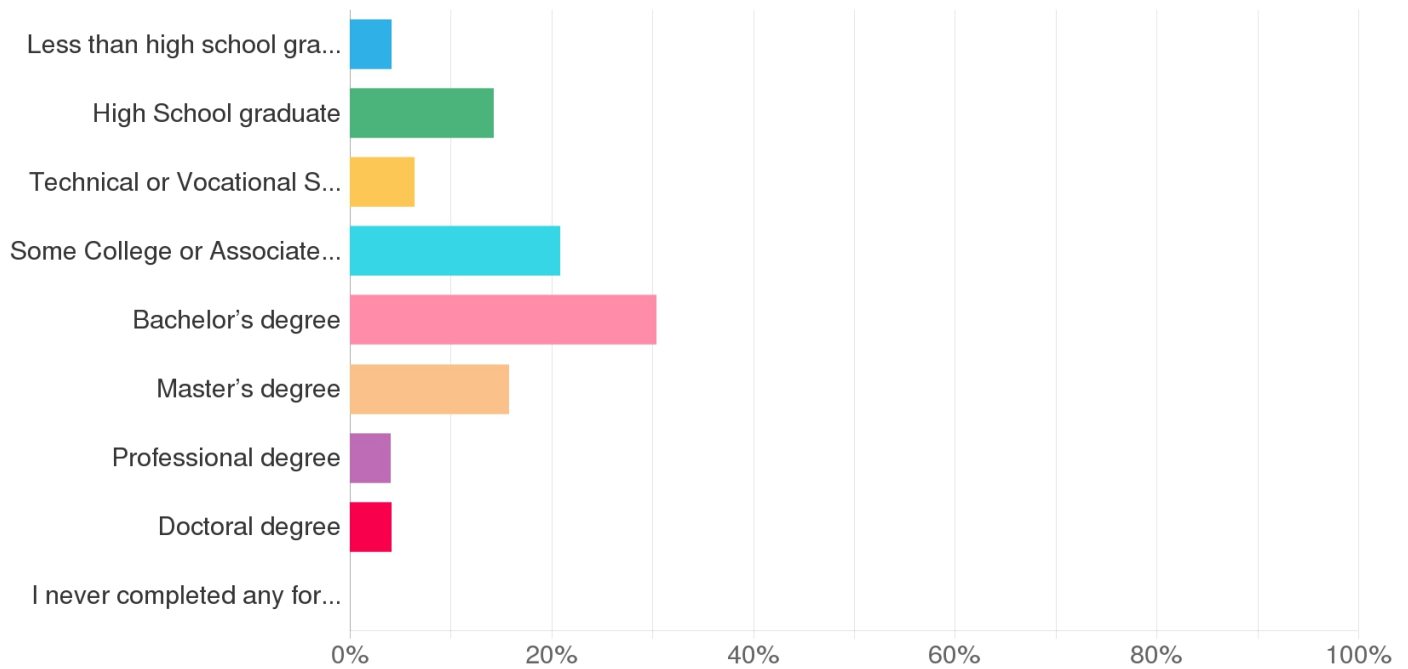

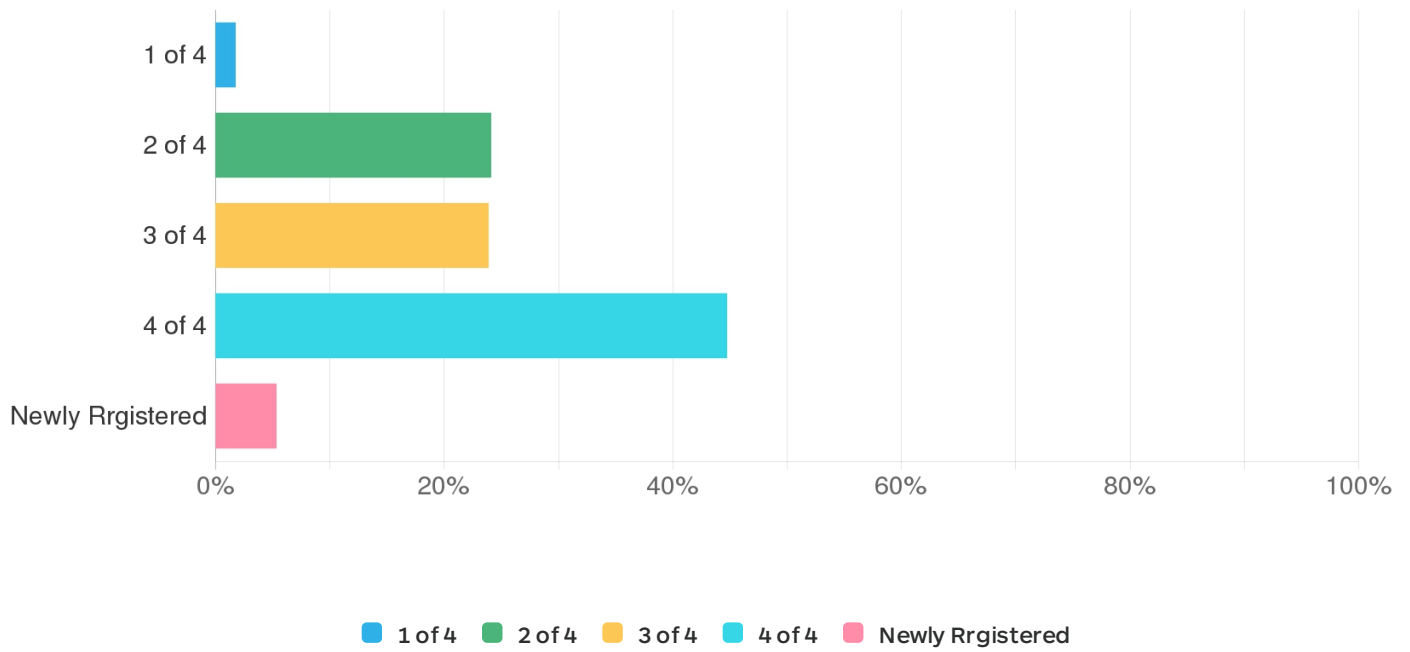

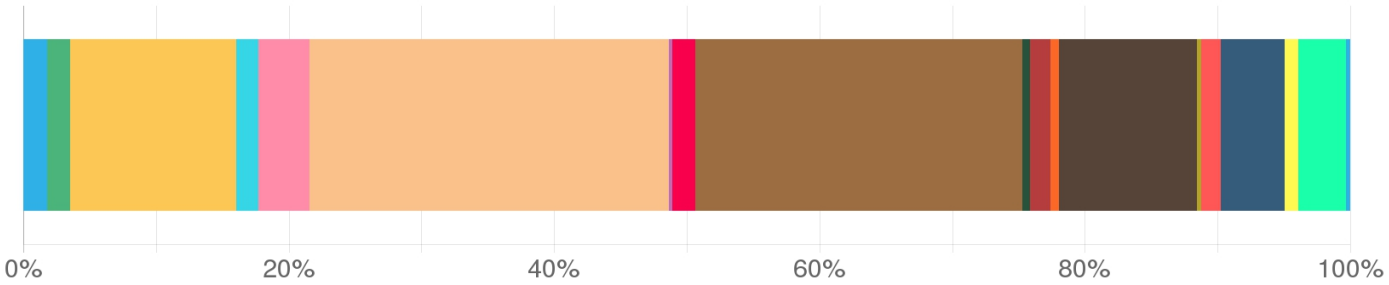
