## Methodology

#### **Study Population**

• Canadian residents, ages 18 and older.

#### **Data Collection**

- A total of n=1537 online surveys were conducted via Leger's online LEO panel.
- Interviews were conducted from February 11 to February 13, 2022.


#### **Statistical Analysis**

- As a non-probability online survey, a margin of error is technically not to be reported.
- If the data were collected through a probability sample, the margin of error would be (n=1537) ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20.
- Using data from the 2016 Census, results were weighted according to age, gender, and region in order to ensure a representative sample of the population.
- The numbers presented have been rounded to the nearest whole number. However, raw values were used to calculate the sums presented and therefore may not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.





# Over 7 in 10 Canadians oppose providing retired governors generals' \$150k/year pension and \$206k/year expense account




#### Subgroup analysis

- Canadians 55 and up are much more likely to oppose this (83%) compared to 18-34-yearolds (57%)
- Quebecers are more likely to oppose this (84%) than Canadians in the ROC (70%)
- Rural Canadians are more likely to oppose this (80%) than suburban Canadians (75%) and urban Canadians (69%)
- Those earning \$100K+ are more likely to oppose this (78%) compared to those earning <\$40K (70%)</li>



# Nearly 8 in 10 oppose keeping post-retirement expense accounts for former governors general -- 60% strongly oppose



#### **Subgroup analysis**

- Those with a university education are more likely to support this (17%) compared to those with a college diploma (13%) or high school/less (10%)
- Canadians 55 and up are more likely to oppose this (87%) compared to 18-34-year-olds (62%)
- Quebecers are more likely to oppose this (88%) than Canadians in the ROC (75%)
