## Survey Results

Prepared by SPRY Strategies
The Clapham Group - American Principles Project 2022 Issue and Ideology Poll was conducted by IVR, Live Landline and Online Mobile Interviews from September 17 - September 20 among a random sample of 1329 registered voters in the states of $A L, N C, M O, O H, O K$ and $P A$. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 2.7 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to $100 \%$ due to rounding.
