The Clapham Group - American Principles Project 2022 Issue and Ideology Poll was conducted by IVR, Live Landline and Online Mobile Interviews from September 17 - September 20 among a random sample of 1329 registered voters in the states of AL, NC, MO, OH, OK and PA. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 2.7 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

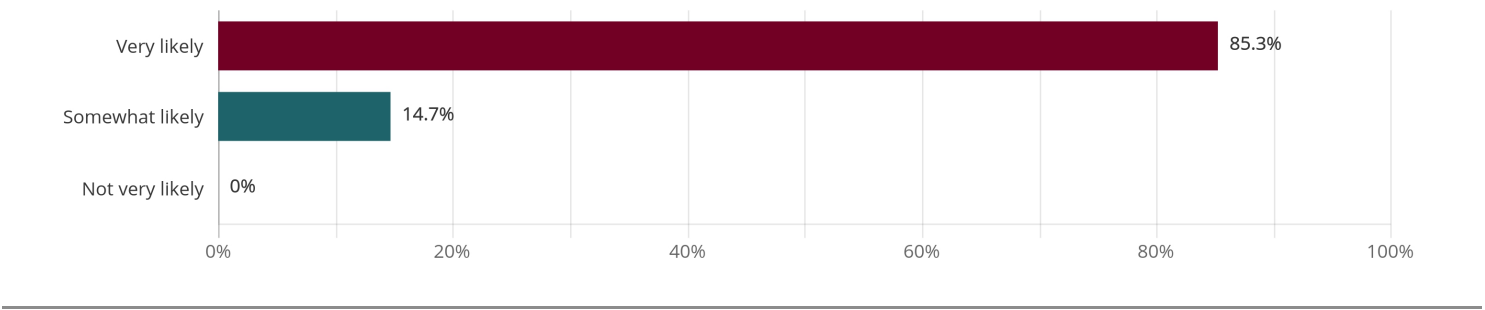

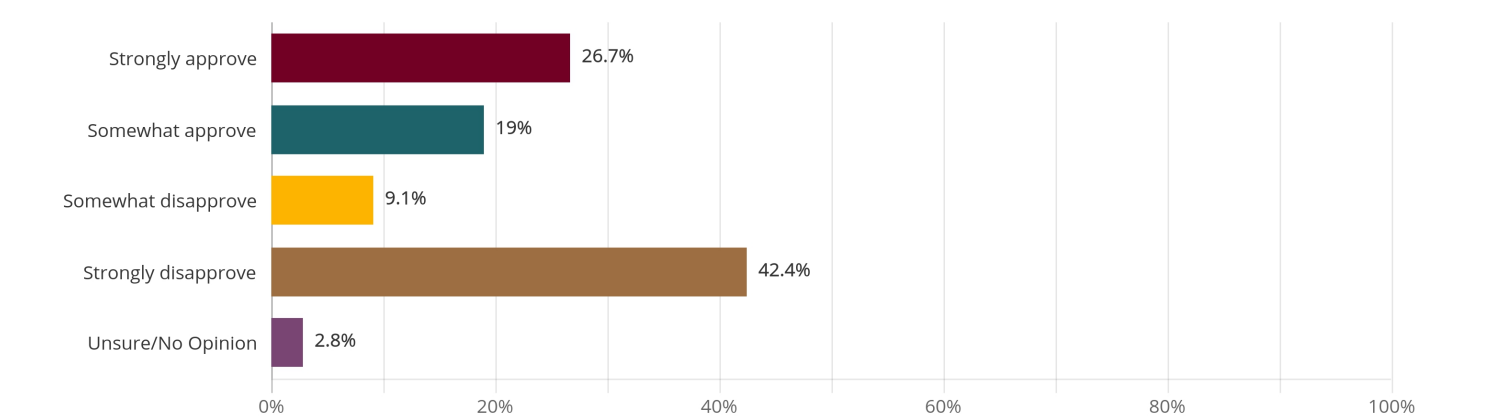

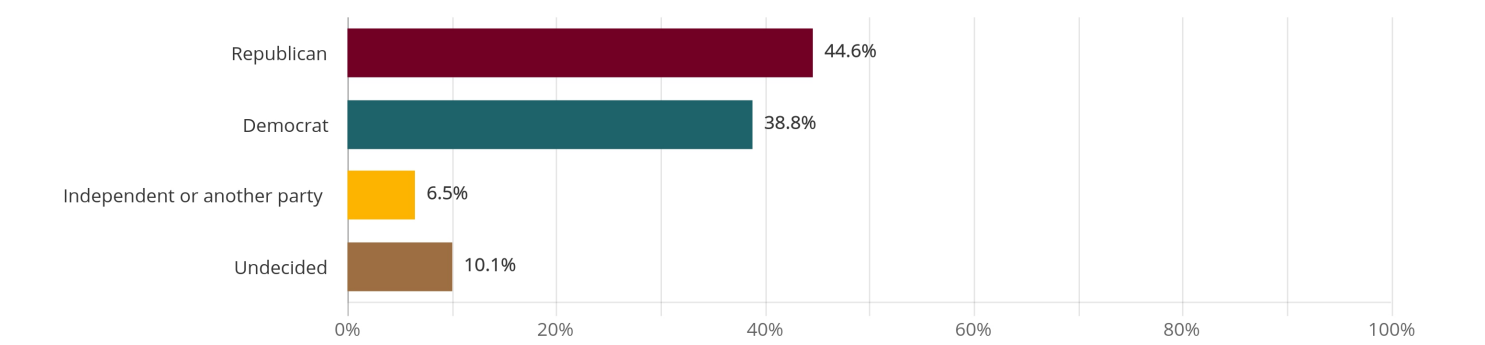

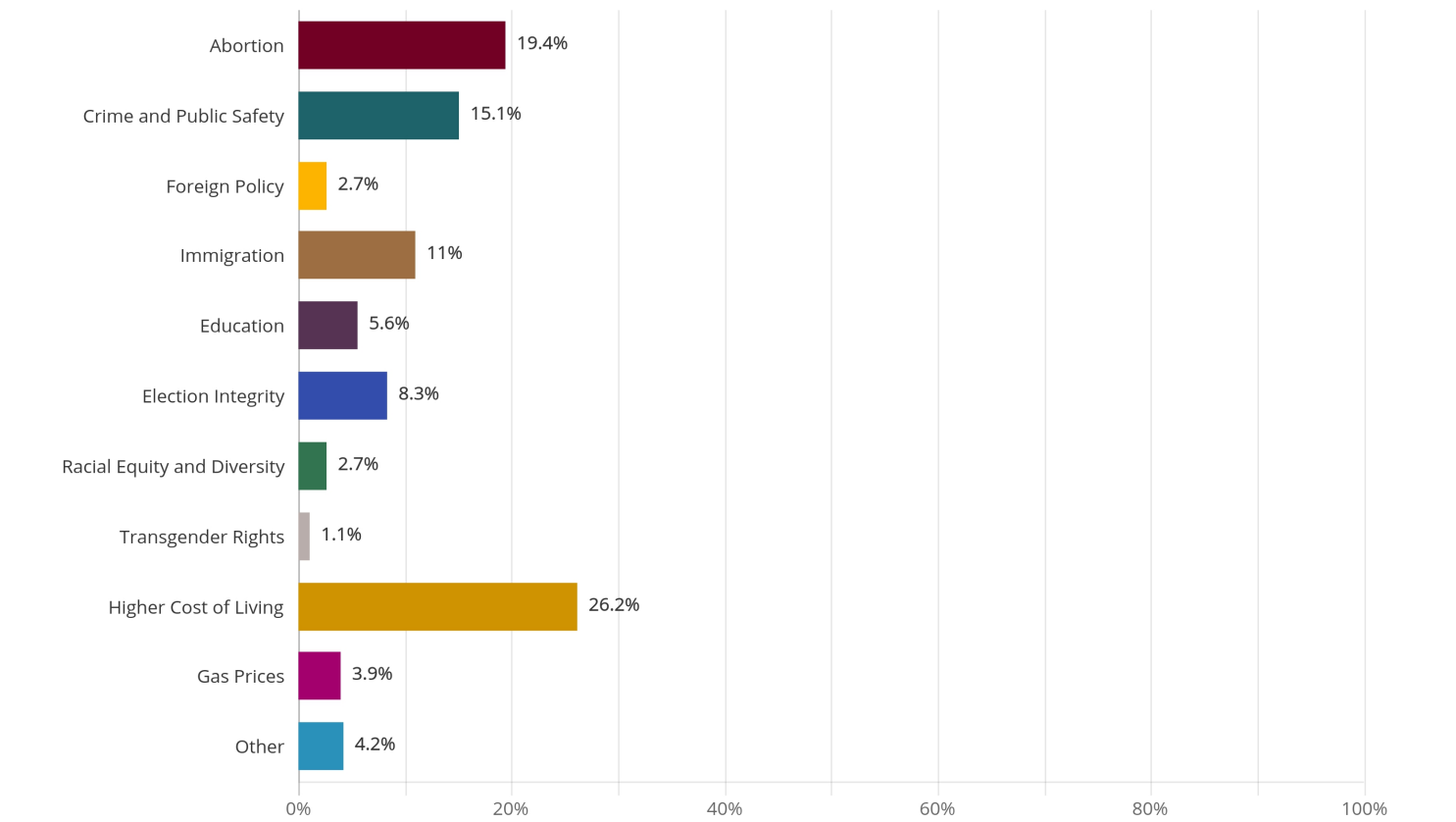

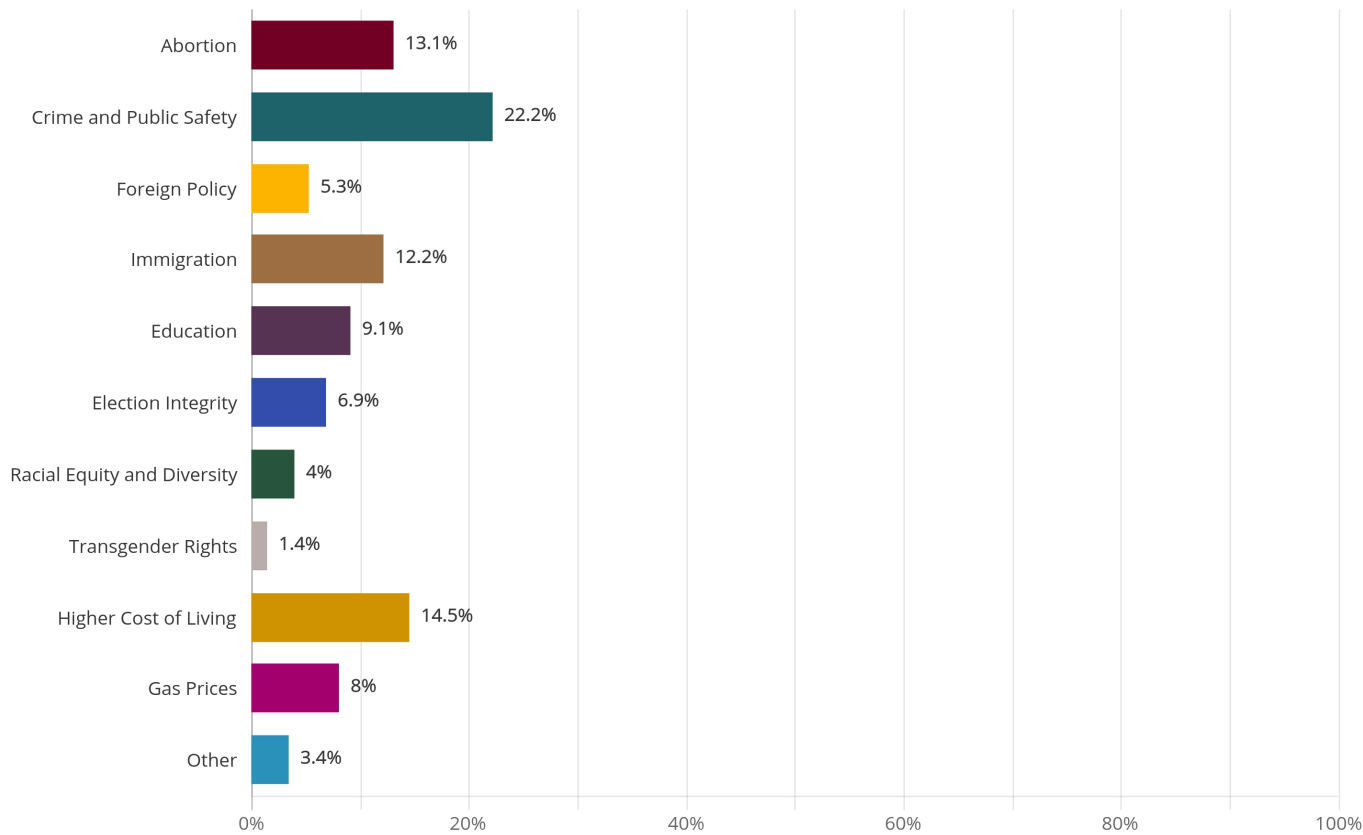

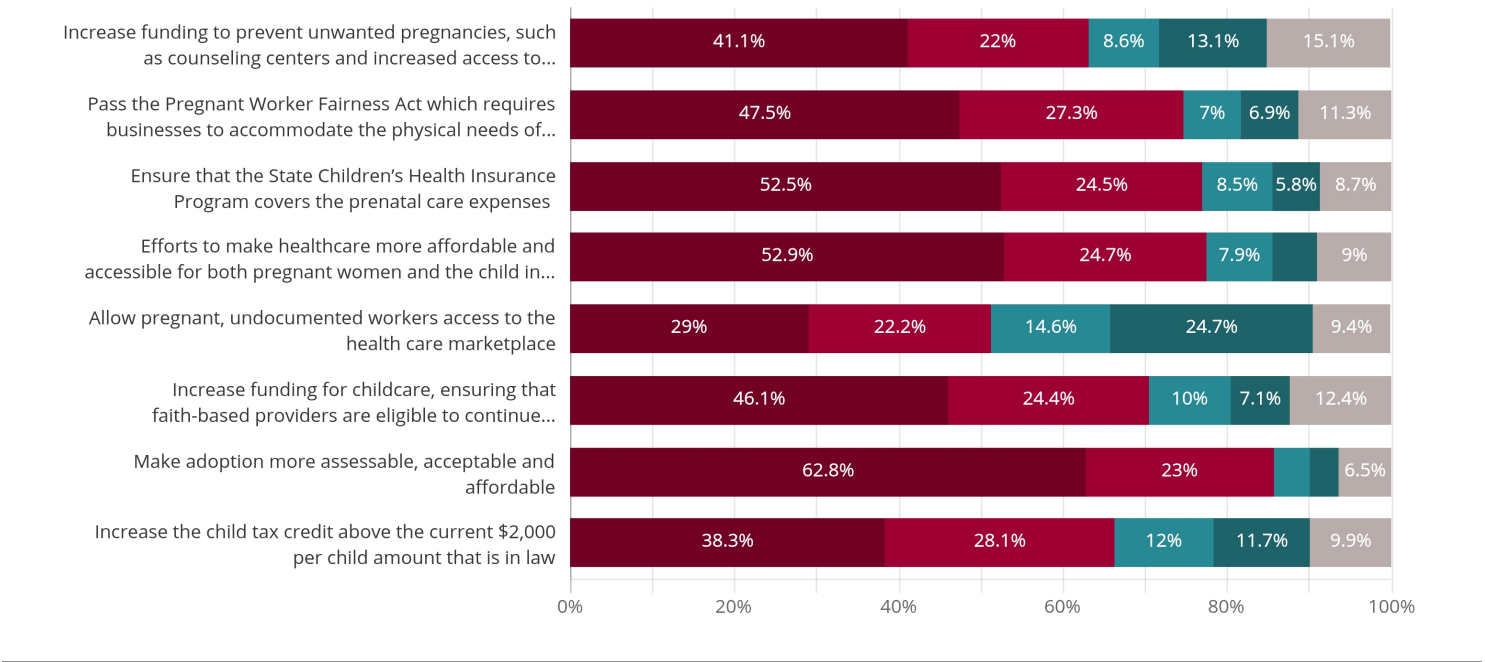

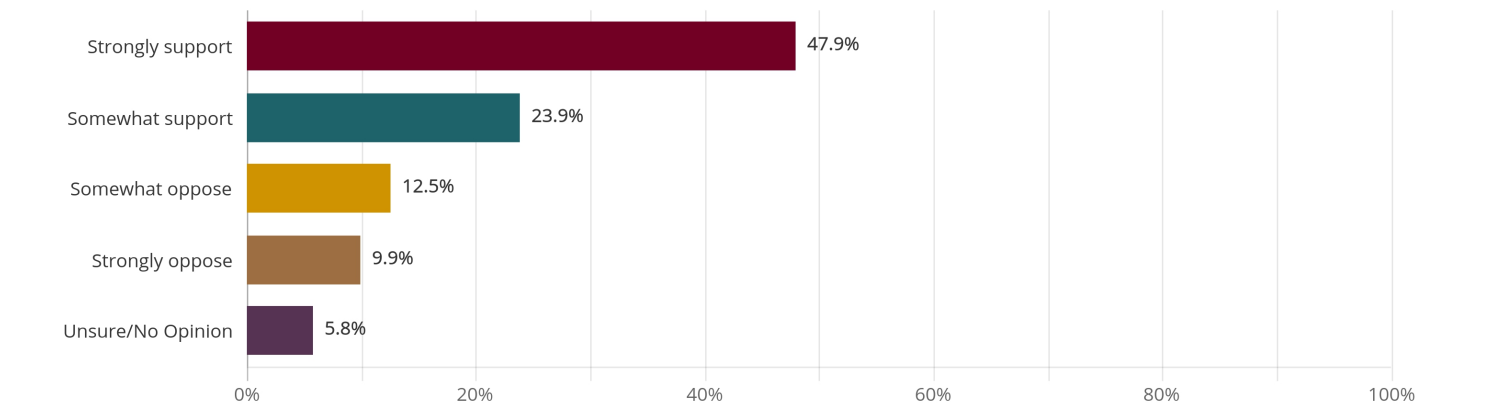

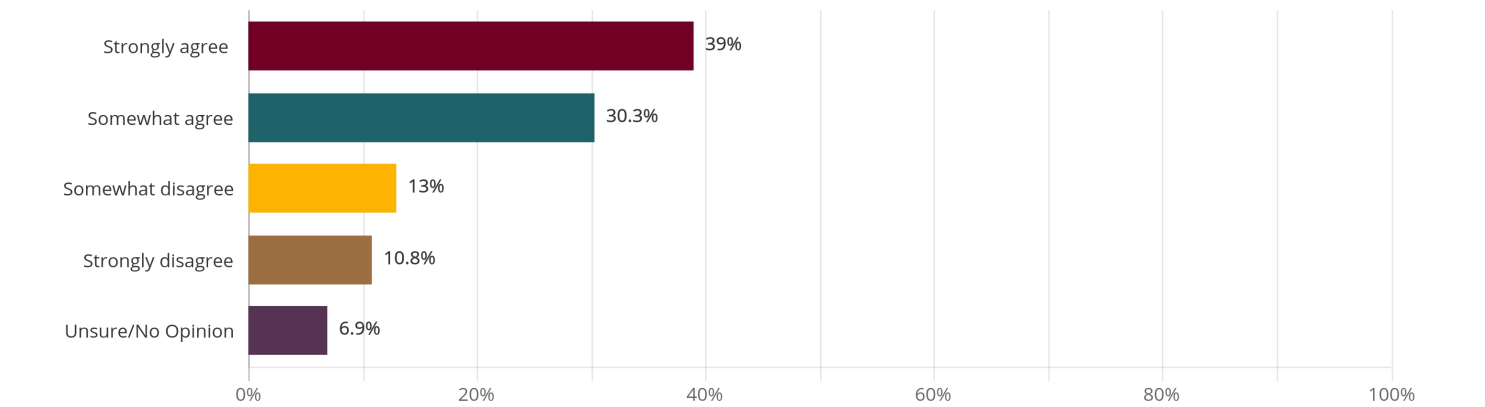

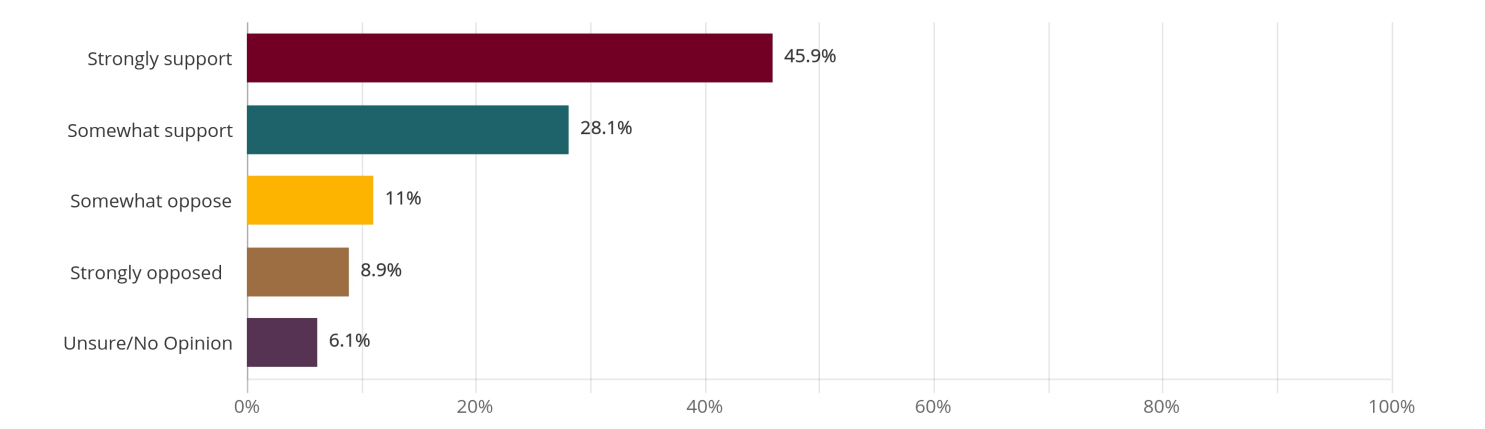

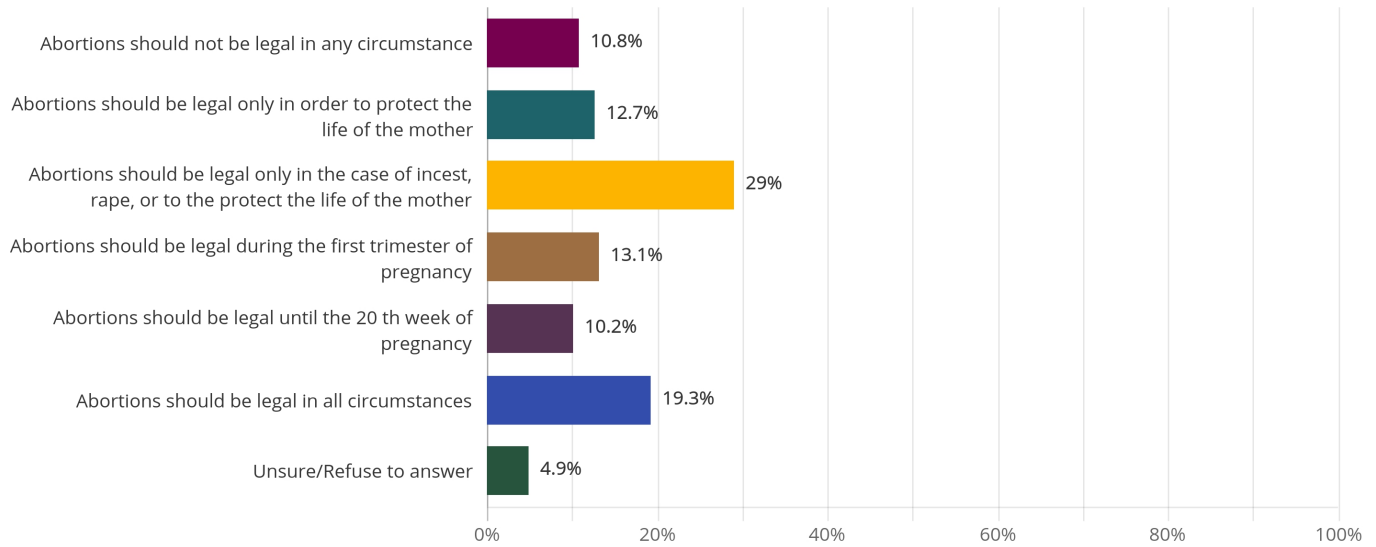

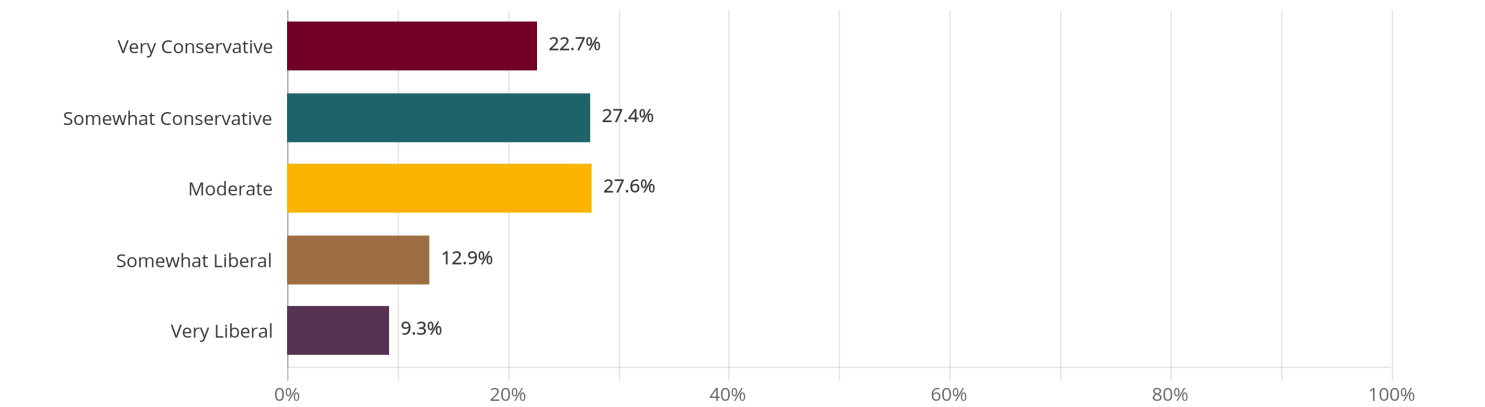

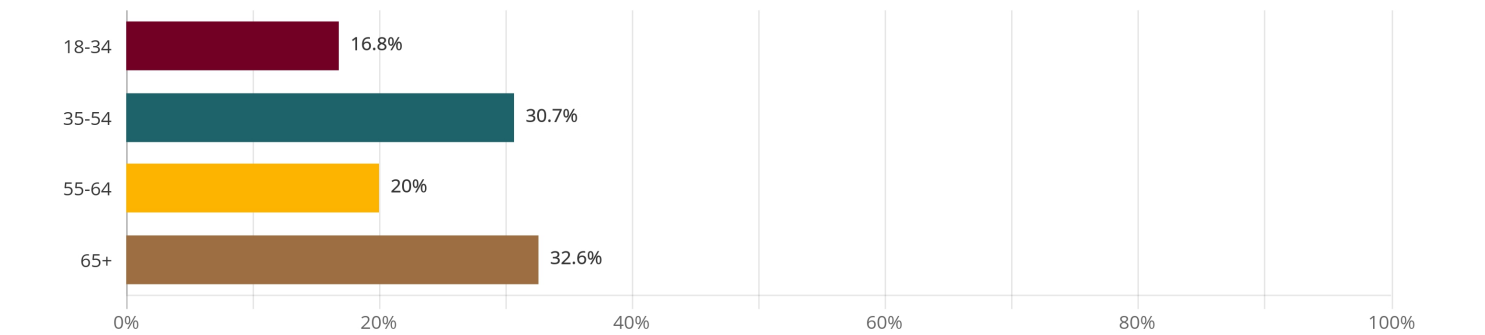

Which of the following is your age range?

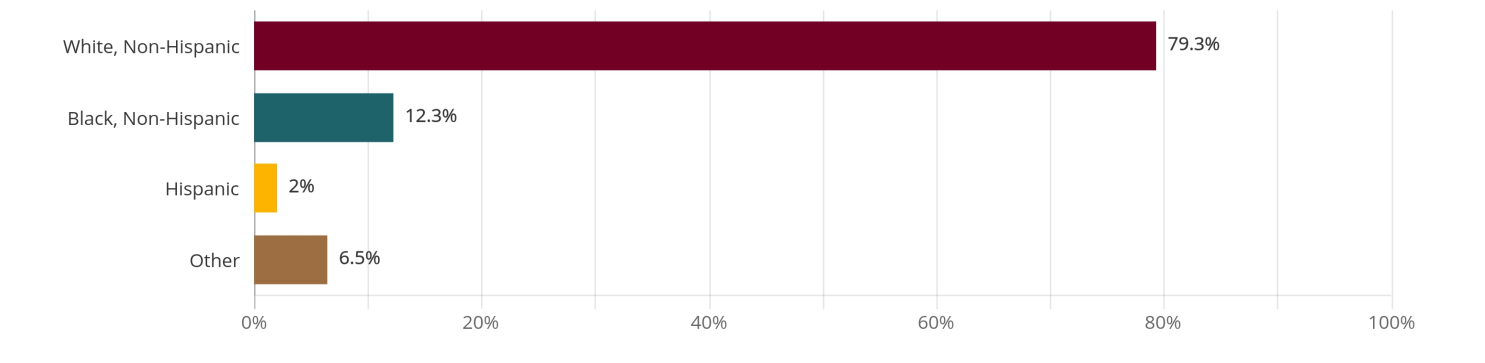

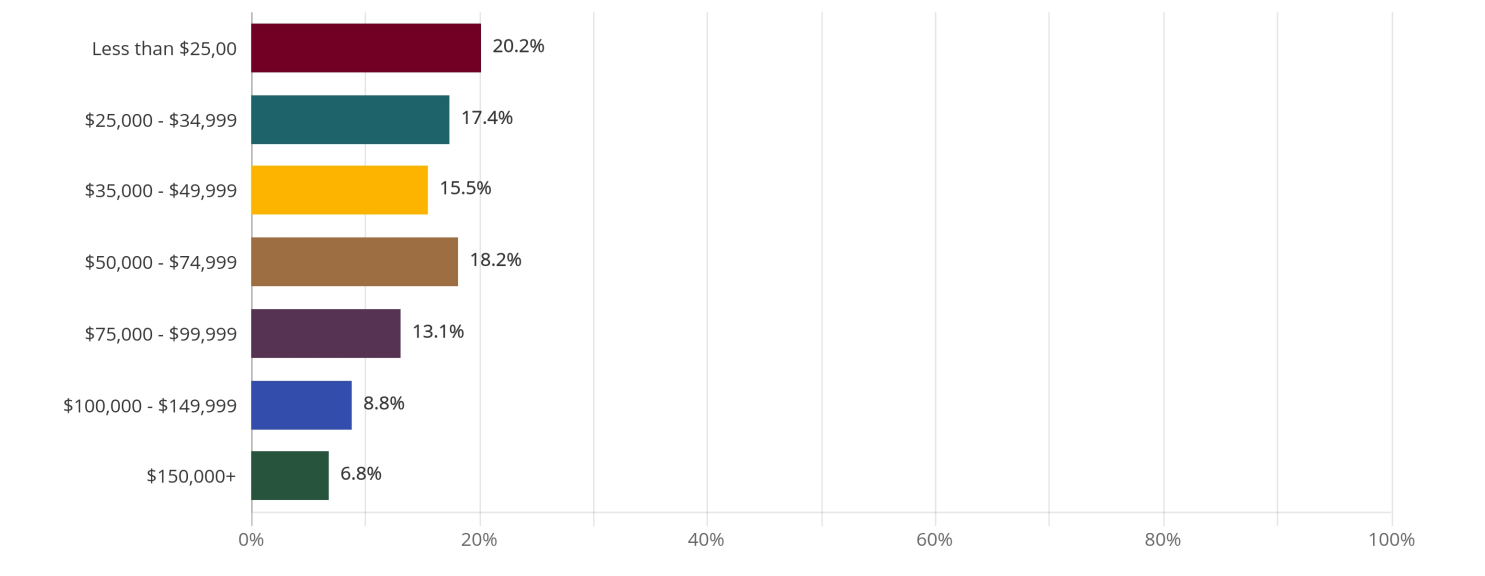

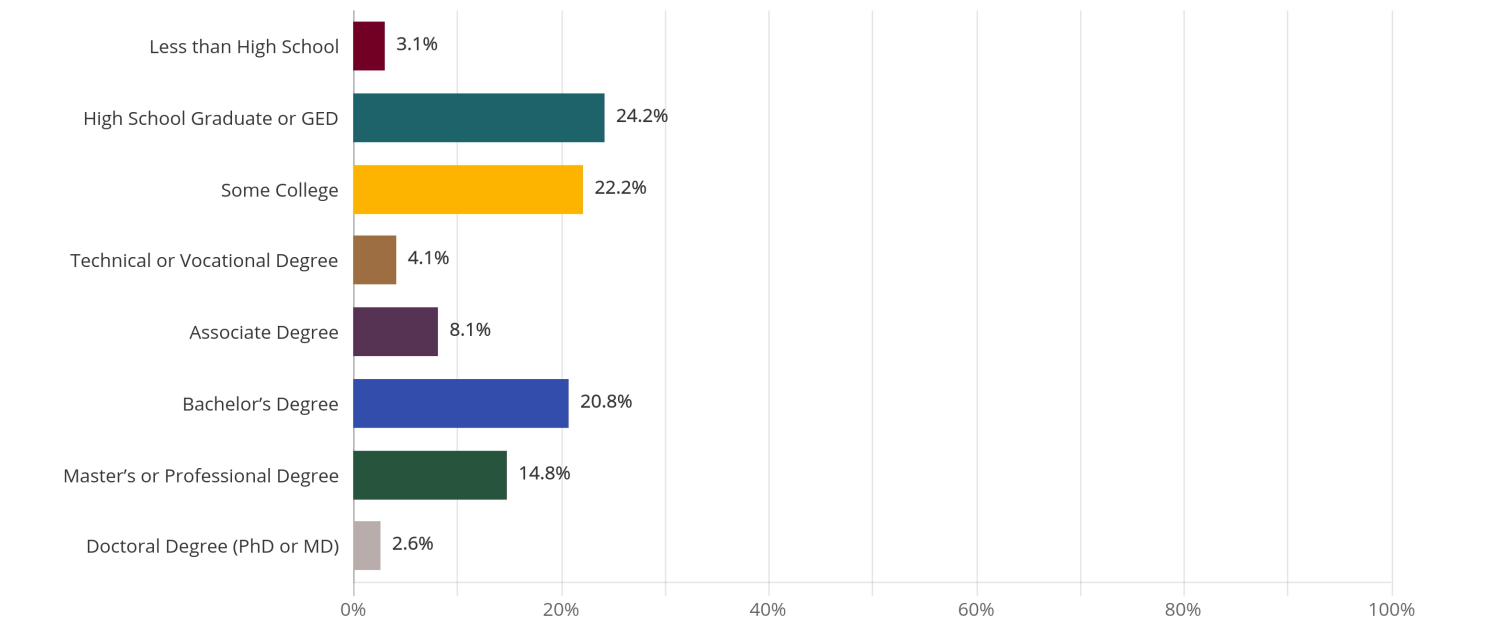

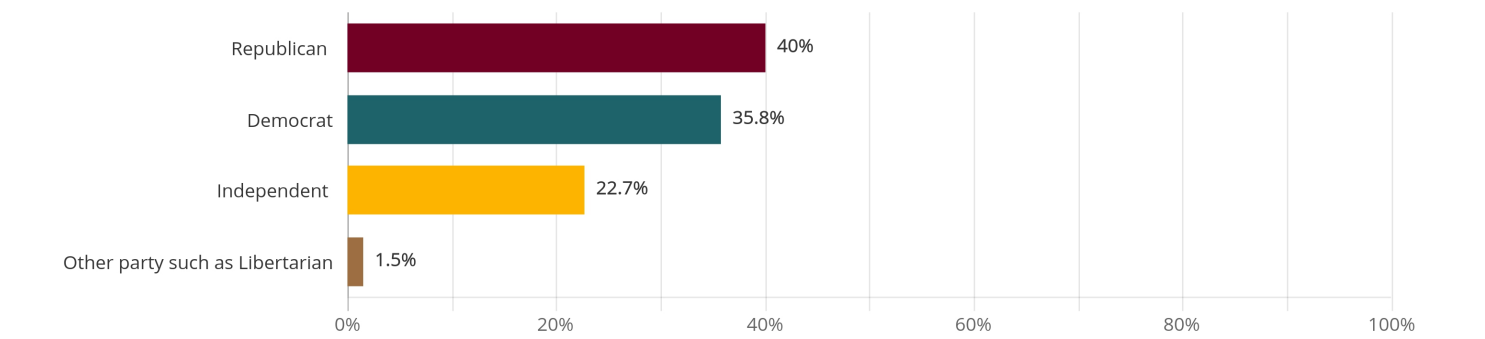

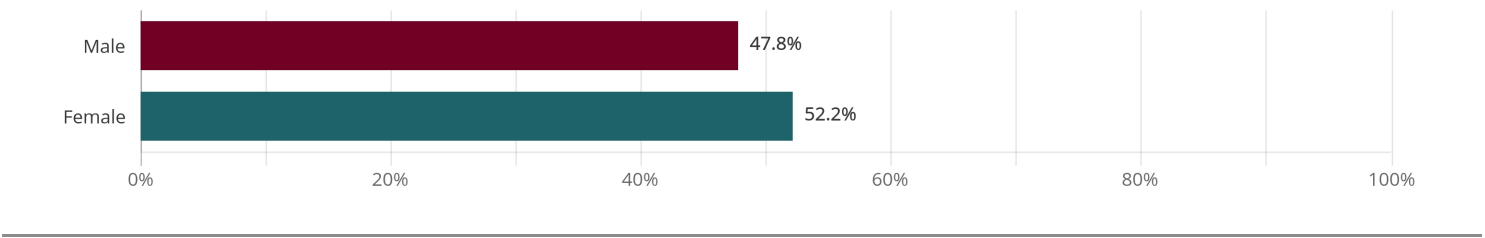

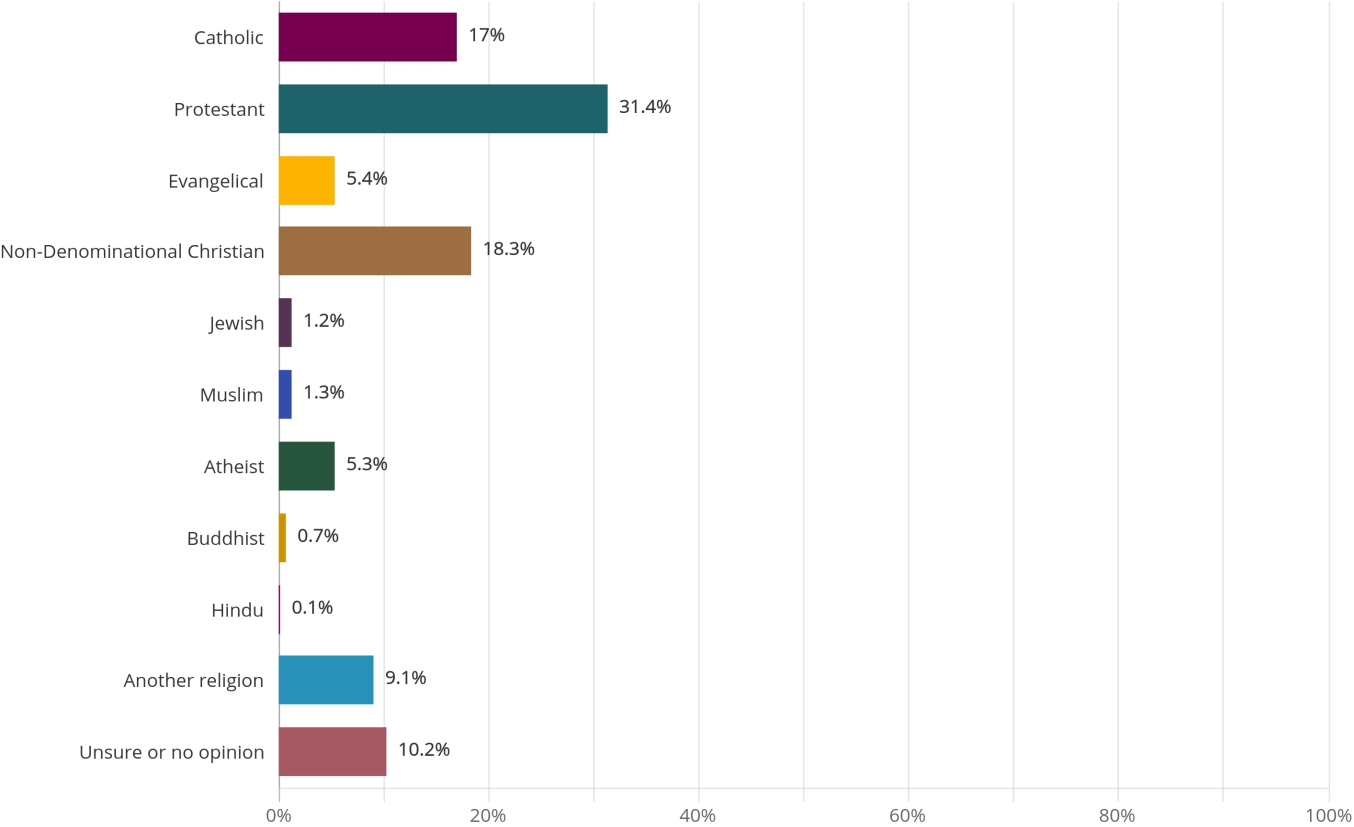

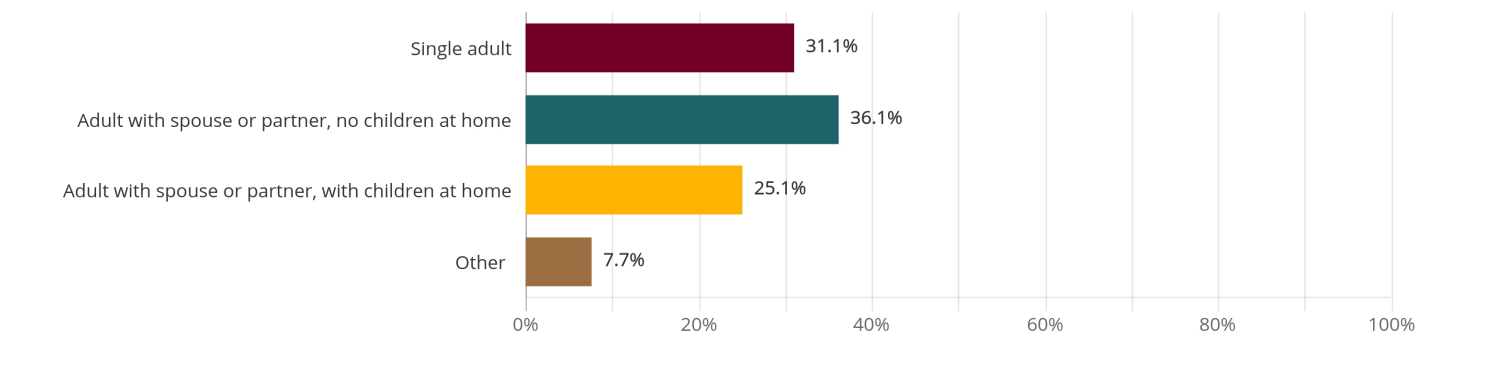

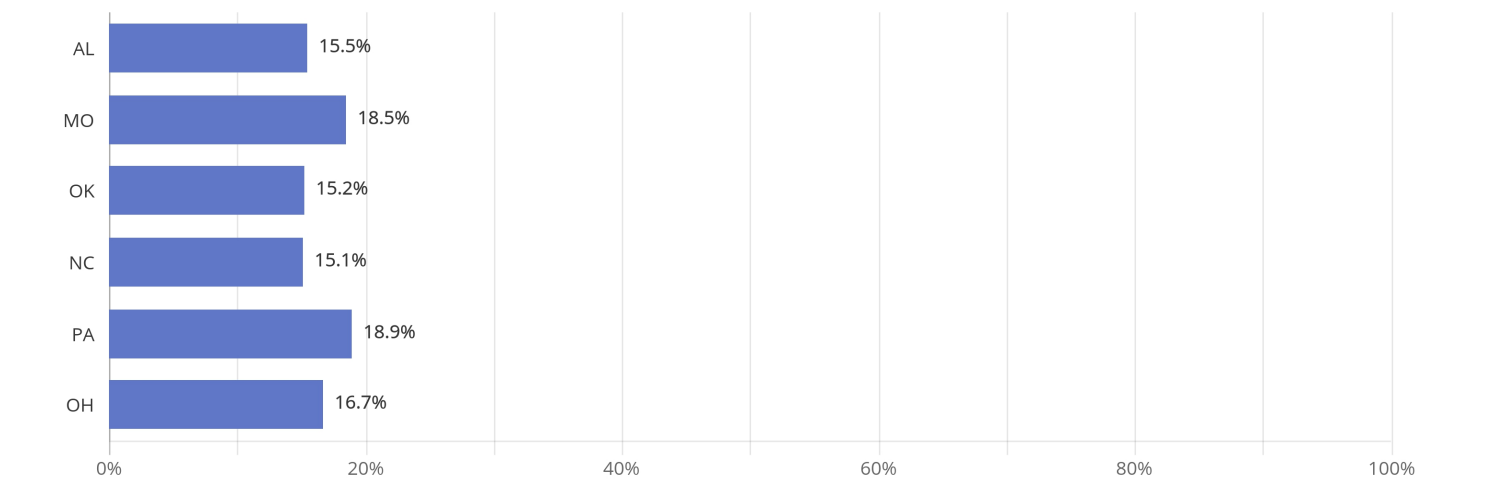
